The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 9th August, 2017 and is hereby published for general information:—

THE INDIAN INSTITUTES OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP) ACT, 2017

No. 23 of 2017

[9th August, 2017.]

An Act to declare certain Indian Institutes of Information Technology established under public-private partnership as institutions of national importance, with a view to develop new knowledge in information technology and to provide manpower of global standards for the information technology industry and to provide for certain other matters connected with such institutions or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by Parliament in the Sixty-eighth Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

CHAPTER I

PRELIMINARY

1. (1) This Act may be called the Indian Institutes of Information Technology (Public-private Partnership) Act, 2017,

Short title and commencement.

(2) It shall come into force on such date as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint.

2. Whereas the objects of the Institutes mentioned in the Schedule are such as to make them institutions of national importance, it is hereby declared that each such Institute is an institution of national importance.

Definitions.

3. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) "appointed day" means the date of establishment of the Institutes established under sub-section (2) of section 4;

(b) "Board", in relation to any Institute, means the Board of Governors referred to in sub-section (1) of section 14;

(c) "Chairperson" means the Chairperson of the Board appointed under sub-section (2) of section 14;

(d) "Co-ordination Forum" means the Co-ordination Forum established under sub-section (1) of section 38;

(e) "Director" means the Director of the Institute;

(f) "existing Institute" means the Institute mentioned in column (3) of the Schedule;

(g) "industry partner" means an individual, or a trust established under the Indian Trusts Act, 1882, or a company established under the Companies Act, 2013, or society formed and registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, or a financial institution or a combination of one or more of such industry partners;

(h) "Institute" means any of the institutions mentioned in column (5) of the Schedule and such other Institutes established under section 11;

(i) "notification" means a notification published in the Official Gazette and the expression "notify" shall be construed accordingly;

(j) "prescribed" means prescribed by rules made under this Act;

(k) "public private partnership" means such partnership under a scheme of the Central Government which provides for establishment of Institute involving collaboration between the Central Government, the State Government and industry partners;

(l) "Schedule" means the Schedule to this Act;

(m) "Senate", in relation to any Institute, means the Senate thereof;

(n) "Statutes" and "Ordinances", in relation to any Institute, mean the Statutes and Ordinances of the Institute made under this Act.

CHAPTER II

THE INSTITUTES

Incorporation
of Institutes.

4. (1) On and from the commencement of this Act, every existing Institute, shall be a body corporate by the same name as mentioned in column (5) of the Schedule.

(2) On and from the appointed day, any other Institute of Information Technology as may be established under section 11 shall be a body corporate by such name as the Central Government may, by notification, specify.

(3) Every existing Institute or any Institute established under sub-section (2) shall have perpetual succession and a common seal, with power, subject to the provisions of this Act, to acquire, hold and dispose of property, both movable and immovable, and to contract, and shall, by its name, sue or be sued.

5. On and from the date of commencement of this Act,—

Effect of
incorporation
of Institutes.

(a) any reference to any existing Institute in any contract or other instrument shall be deemed to be reference to the corresponding Institute mentioned in column (5) of the Schedule;

(b) all properties, movable and immovable, belonging to every existing Institute shall vest in the corresponding Institute mentioned in column (5) of the Schedule;

(c) all rights, debts and other liabilities of every existing Institute shall be transferred to, and be the rights and liabilities of, the corresponding Institute mentioned in column (5) of the Schedule;

(d) every person employed by any existing Institute, immediately before such commencement, shall hold his office or service in the corresponding Institute mentioned in column (5) of the Schedule, with the same tenure, at the same remuneration and upon the same terms and conditions and with the same rights and privileges as to pension, leave, gratuity, provident fund and other matters as he would have held the same if this Act had not been enacted and shall continue to do so unless and until his employment is terminated or until such tenure, remuneration and the terms and conditions are duly altered by the Statutes;

Provided that if the alteration so made is not acceptable to such employee, his employment may be terminated by the Institute in accordance with the terms of the contract with the employee or, if no provision is made therein in this behalf, on payment to him by the Institute of compensation equivalent to three months' remuneration in the case of permanent employees and one month's remuneration in case of other employees;

Provided further that any reference, by whatever form of words, to the Director, Registrar and other officers of any existing Institute, in any law for the time being in force, or in any instrument or other document, shall be deemed to be reference to the Director, Registrar and other officers of the corresponding Institute mentioned in column (5) of the Schedule;

(e) every person pursuing, before the commencement of this Act, any academic or research course in any existing Institute, shall be deemed to have migrated and registered with the corresponding Institute mentioned in column (5) of the Schedule, on such commencement at the same level of course in the Institute from which such person migrated;

(f) all suits and other legal proceedings instituted or which could have been instituted by or against an existing Institute, immediately before the commencement of this Act, shall be continued or instituted by or against the corresponding Institute mentioned in column (5) of the Schedule.

6. Every Institute shall have the following objectives, namely:

Objects of
Institute

(a) to emerge amongst the foremost institutions in information technology and allied fields of knowledge in the global context;

(b) to advance new knowledge and innovation in information technology and allied fields to empower the nation to the forefront in the global context;

(c) to develop competent and capable youth imbued with the spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship with the social and environmental orientation to meet the knowledge needs of the country and provide global leadership in information technology and allied fields;

(d) to promote and provide transparency of highest order in matters of admission, appointment to various positions, academic evaluation, administration and finance.

Powers and functions of Institute.

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, every Institute shall exercise the following powers and perform the following functions, namely:—

(a) to provide instructions in such fields of knowledge relating to information technology and allied areas as the Institute may deem fit, for the advancement of learning and dissemination of knowledge;

(b) to lead, organise and conduct research and innovation in information technology and allied fields of knowledge in such manner as the Institute may deem fit, including in collaboration or in association with any other Institute, educational institution, research organisation, body corporate or financial organisations at national or global level;

(c) to hold examinations and grant degrees, diplomas and other academic distinctions or titles and to confer honorary degrees;

(d) to create academic, administrative, technical, ministerial and other posts under the Institute other than the post of Director of the Institute and to make appointments thereto;

(e) to appoint persons working in any other Institute or educational institution or involved in research of significance in any industry as adjunct, guest or visiting faculty of the Institute on such terms and for such duration as the Institute may decide;

(f) to create administrative and other posts and to make appointments thereto on the basis of criteria as may be decided by the Board;

(g) to make provision for dissemination of knowledge emerging from research and for that purpose to enter into such arrangements, including consultancy and advisory services, with other institutions, industry, civil society or other organisations, as the Institute may deem necessary;

(h) to create a website, highlight all information not restricted to those related to students, admission, fee, administrative structure, policies including recruitment rules, faculty and non-faculty posts, annual reports and financial details including statement of account of the Institute;

(i) to determine, specify and receive payment of fees and other charges, as the Institute may deem fit, from students and any other person, institution or body corporate for instructions and other services, including training, consultancy and advisory services, provided by the Institute;

(j) to deal with any property belonging to, or vested in, the Institute in such manner as the Institute may deem fit for advancement of the objectives of the Institute;

Provided that no land or other immovable property shall be disposed of by the Institute without the prior approval of the concerned State Government and the Central Government;

(k) to receive gifts, grants, donations or benefactions from the Government and to receive bequests, donations and transfer of movable or immovable properties from testators, donors or transferors, as the case may be;

(l) to co-operate with educational or other institutions in any part of the world having objects wholly or partly similar to those of the Institute by exchange of teachers and scholars and generally in such manner as may be conducive to their common objects;

(m) to establish and maintain such infrastructure as may be necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of the objectives of the Institute;

(n) to institute and award fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, prizes and medals; and

(e) to do all such things as may be necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objectives of the Institute.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this Act, every Institute may take up the following works, namely:—

(a) supporting and collaborating with educational Institutes imparting technical or information technology courses located in the zone or region;

(b) advising the State Governments and Union territory Administrations included in its zone in matters of information technology and other technological issues referred by them to the Institute for advice.

8. (1) Every Institute shall be open to all citizens irrespective of gender, caste, creed, disability, domicile, ethnicity, social or economic background.

Institutes to be open to all races, creeds and classes.

(2) No bequest, donation or transfer of any property shall be accepted by any Institute which in the opinion of the Co-ordination Forum involves conditions or obligations opposed to the spirit and object of this section.

(3) Admissions to every programme of study in each Institute shall be based on merit assessed through transparent and reasonable criteria disclosed through its prospectus, prior to the commencement of the process of admission by such Institute:

Provided that every such Institute shall be a Central Educational Institution for the purposes of the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006.

9. All teaching at each of the Institute shall be conducted by or in the name of the Institute in accordance with the Statutes and Ordinances made in this behalf.

Teaching at Institute

10. (1) Every Institute shall be a not-for-profit legal entity and no part of the surplus, if any, in revenue of such Institute, after meeting all expenditure in regard to its operations under this Act, shall be invested for any purpose other than for the growth and development of such Institute or for conducting research therein.

Institute to be a distinct legal entity not for profit.

(2) Every Institute shall strive to raise funds for creation of a corpus for self sufficiency, sustainability and future development of the Institute

11. (1) The State Government shall identify at least one industry partner, and preferably three industry partners, for collaboration and submit a proposal to the Central Government.

Establishment of Institute by Central Government, State Government and industry partners

(2) The Central Government shall examine the proposal on the basis of such criteria, as may be prescribed, which shall include the following, namely:—

(a) the investment of capital required for establishing the proposed Institute to be borne by the Central Government, the concerned State Government and industry partners in the ratio 50:35:15 and recurring expenditure, as may be considered necessary during the first five years of operation, to be made available by the Central Government;

Provided that the ratio of investment of capital required for establishing the proposed Institute in North Eastern States shall be 57.5:35:7.5;

(b) the expertise and standing of the industry partners proposed in sub section (1) in the field of information technology;

(c) the assessment of the capability, financial and other resources of industry partners to support the Institute;

(d) the suitability of adequate land, to the extent of fifty to hundred acres, to be provided by the State Government free of cost;

(e) the availability of, or the commitment of the State Government to make available, adequate physical infrastructure namely, water, electricity, road connectivity and security, at the proposed site

(3) The Central Government may, with the concurrence of the concerned State Government, suggest modifications, if any, to the proposal submitted to it under sub-section (1).

(4) Where a proposal submitted by the State Government under sub-section (1) is not acceptable to the Central Government, the Central Government shall communicate its decision to that State Government, specifying the reasons for such decision.

(5) The Central Government shall, on acceptance of the proposal with modifications, if any, under sub-section (3), enter into a memorandum of understanding or an agreement with the concerned State Government and the industry partners for the establishment of the proposed Institute.

(6) The industry partner shall—

(a) actively participate in the governance of the Institute within the overall framework;

(b) support and facilitate joint research projects with the Indian Institutes of Information Technology either through funding, collaboration or in any other manner;

(c) depute experienced individuals as adjunct faculty;

(d) encourage, enable, support and mentor students to do research project as a part of their course curriculum, within their enterprise;

(e) accept faculty members of the the Indian Institutes of Information Technology on a sabbatical to work for short period with the industry;

(f) co-create programs as per the requirements of the industry with the Institution;

(g) provide internship to students from the the Indian Institutes of Information Technology;

(h) facilitate for placement of students from the Indian Institutes of Information Technology;

(i) sponsor their eligible employees for doctorate studies in the Indian Institutes of Information Technology; and

(j) fund and mentor the startups in the Institution.

(7) Every memorandum of understanding or agreement referred to in sub-section (5) shall contain—

(a) the investment proposal of capital in establishment of the Institute and the respective shares as may be prescribed;

(b) the first Statutes of the Institute;

(c) the commitment of the Central Government, the concerned State Government, and the industry partner in ensuring autonomy to the proposed Institute; and

(d) the conditions, if the industry partners pulls out.

CHAPTER III

AUTHORITIES OF INDIAN INSTITUTES OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ESTABLISHED IN PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP

Visitor,

12. (1) The President of India shall be the Visitor of every Institute.

(2) The Visitor may appoint one or more persons to review the work and progress of any Institute and to hold inquiries into the affairs thereof and to report thereon in such manner as the Visitor may direct.

(3) Upon receipt of any such report, the Visitor may take such action and issue such directions as he considers necessary in respect of any of the matters dealt within the report and the Institute shall be bound to comply with such directions within a reasonable time.

13. The following shall be the authorities of an Institute, namely:—

Authorities of Institute.

(a) Visitor;

(b) Board of Governors;

(c) Senate;

(d) Finance Committee;

(e) such other authorities or posts as may be declared by the Statutes to be the authorities of the Institute.

14. (i) The Board of Governors of each Institute shall be the principal policy making and executive body of the Institute.

Board of Governors.

(2) The Board shall consist of the following members, namely:—

(a) Chairperson, an eminent technologist or industrialist or educationist to be nominated by the Visitor on the recommendation of the Central Government;

(b) one nominee each of the Central Government and the concerned State Government;

(c) three eminent persons, of which at least one shall be a woman, appointed by the Board out of industry, research laboratories, and civil society, one from each category;

(d) two eminent academicians appointed by the Board;

(e) one nominee representing each of the industry partners;

Provided that if there are more than two industry partners then the number of representatives of industry partners at any time would be limited to two, chosen amongst themselves by rotation every two years;

(f) Director of an Indian Institute of Technology or a National Institute of Technology located in the region, to be nominated by the Board;

(g) two members from the faculty of the Institute, preferably one Professor and one Associate/Assistant Professor, to be nominated by the Senate;

(h) one person from the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes distinguished in the field of education or industry or social service or public service, to be nominated by the Board, in case any of the above do not belong to the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes; and

(i) Director of the Institute, *ex officio*.

(3) Registrar of the concerned Institute shall be the *ex officio* non-member Secretary of the Board.

(4) The First Board of Governors shall be notified by the Central Government by obtaining nominations under sub-section (2), other than the members referred to in clauses (c), (d), (f) and (h), which shall be decided in the first meeting of the Board of Governors.

15. (1) Save as otherwise provided in this section, the term of office of the Chairperson or any other member of the Board, other than an *ex officio* member, shall be for a period of three years from the date of nomination.

Term of office of vacancies among and allowances payable to members of Board.

(2) The term of office of an *ex officio* member shall continue so long as the member holds the office by virtue of which he is a member.

(3) A member of the Board, other than an *ex officio* member, who fails to attend three consecutive meetings of the Board without the leave of absence, shall cease to be a member of the Board.

(4) One-third of the members of the Board shall form a quorum of the Board, provided at least three members are from members referred to in clauses other than clauses (e), (g) and (i) of sub-section (2) of section 14.

(5) The members of the Board shall be entitled to such allowances, as may be laid down in Statutes, for attending meetings of the Board or as may be convened by the Institute.

Resignation
of
Chairperson.

16. (1) The Chairperson may, by writing under his hand addressed to the Visitor, resign his office.

(2) Any member of the Board, except *ex officio* members, may, by writing under his hand addressed to the Chairperson, resign his office.

Powers and
functions of
Board.

17. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Board shall be responsible for the general policy making, superintendence, providing direction and shall have the power to frame, amend, modify or rescind the Statutes and the Ordinances governing the affairs of the Institute to achieve the objectives specified in section 6.

(2) Without prejudice to the provisions of sub-section (1), the Board shall have the following powers, namely:—

- (a) to decide questions of policy relating to the Institute;
- (b) to establish departments, faculties or schools of studies and initiate programmes or courses of study at the Institute;
- (c) to examine and approve the annual budget estimates of the Institute;
- (d) to examine and approve the plan for development of the Institute and to identify sources of finance for implementation of the plan;
- (e) to create teaching, academic, administrative, technical and other posts and to make appointments thereto;
- (f) to provide by the Statutes, the qualifications, criteria and processes for appointment to teaching and other posts in the Institute;
- (g) to approve fees and other charges payable for pursuit of studies, courses or programmes in the Institute;
- (h) to make Statutes, subject to provisions of section 32, governing the administration, management and operations of such Institute;
- (i) to grant degrees, diplomas and other academic distinctions or titles, and to institute and award fellowships, scholarships, prizes and medals; and
- (j) to exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be conferred or imposed by this Act or the Statutes.

(3) The Board may, subject to the provisions of this Act and the Statutes, delegate such powers and functions to the Senate or the Director, as the Board may deem fit.

(4) The Board shall put in place policies to make the Institute self-sustaining within a period of five years.

(5) The Board shall periodically conduct a review of the performance of the Director with specific reference to the leadership in the achievement of the objectives of the Institute.

(6) The Board shall in exercise of the powers and discharge of functions strive to provide autonomy in academic matters to the Senate and departments of faculties or schools, as the case may be.

(7) Wherein the opinion of the Director or the Chairperson, the situation is so emergent that an immediate decision needs to be taken in the interest of the Institute, the Chairperson, in consultation with the Director, may issue such orders as may be necessary, recording in writing the grounds for the opinion:

Provided that such orders shall be submitted for ratification of the Board in the next meeting.

18. (1) The Senate of every Institute shall consist of the following persons, namely: Senate

(a) the Director of the Institute who shall be the *ex officio* Chairperson of the Senate;

(b) all Deans, *ex officio*;

(c) heads of all departments, faculties or schools, *ex officio*, as the case may be, of the Institute;

(d) all full-time professors other than the Deans or heads of the Departments;

(e) three persons from amongst educationists of repute or persons from another field related to the activities of the Institute who are not in service of the Institute, nominated by the Board;

(f) three persons who are not members of teaching staff co-opted by the Senate for their specialised knowledge; and

(g) Registrar of the Institute, *ex officio* Secretary.

(2) The term of office of members nominated under clauses (e) and (f) shall be for a period of two years from the date of nomination.

(3) The term of office of an *ex officio* member shall continue so long as the member holds the office by virtue of which he is a member.

19. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances, the Senate shall be the principal academic body of the Institute and shall have the power to enact, amend or modify the Ordinances governing academic matters and the affairs and well-being of students. Powers and functions of Senate.

(2) Without prejudice to the provisions of sub section (1), the Senate shall have the following powers, namely—

(a) to specify the criteria and procedure for admission to courses or programmes of study offered by the Institute;

(b) to recommend to the Board creation of teaching and other academic posts, determination of the number and emoluments of such posts and defining the duties and conditions of service of teachers and other academic posts;

(c) to recommend to the Board about starting of new programmes or courses of study;

(d) to specify the broad academic content of programmes and courses of study and undertake modifications therein;

(e) to specify the academic calendar and approve grant of degrees, diplomas and other academic distinctions or titles;

(f) to appoint examiners, moderators, tabulators and such other personnel for different examinations;

(g) to recognise diplomas and degrees of Universities and other Institutes and to determine equivalence with the diplomas and degrees of the Institute;

(h) to suggest measures for departmental co-ordination;

(i) to make major recommendations to the Board of Governors on—

(A) measures for improvement of standard of teaching, training and research;

(B) institution of chairs, fellowships, scholarships, studentships, freeships, medals and prizes and other related matters;

(C) establishment or abolition of departments or centres; and

(D) academic functioning of the Institute, discipline, residence, admissions, examinations, award of fellowships and studentships, freeships, concessions, attendance and other related matters;

(j) to appoint sub-committees to advise on such specific matters as may be referred to by the Board or by itself;

(k) to consider the recommendations of the sub-committees and to take such action including making of recommendations to the Board as may be required;

(l) to take periodical review of the activities of the departments or centres and to take appropriate action including making of recommendations to the Board with a view to maintain and improve the standards of instructions, in the institutions; and

(m) to exercise such other powers and discharge such other functions as may be assigned to it, by Statutes or otherwise, by the Board.

Finance
Committee.

20. (1) The Finance Committee of each Institute shall consist of the following persons, namely:—

(a) the Chairperson of the Board shall be the *ex officio* Chairperson of the Committee;

(b) one representative of the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education handling the matters relating to finance, *ex officio*;

(c) one representative of the State Government in which the Institute is located, *ex officio*;

(d) one representative of the industry partners chosen from amongst themselves;

(e) the Director, *ex officio*; and

(f) one officer-in-charge of finance and accounts of the Institute, *ex officio* Secretary.

(2) The members of the Finance Committee other than *ex officio* members shall hold office for a term of three years.

Powers and
functions of
Finance

21. The Finance Committee shall examine the accounts, scrutinise proposals for expenditure and financial estimates of the Institute and thereafter submit it to the Board together with its comments for approval.

Meetings.

22. (1) The Chairperson shall ordinarily preside over the meetings of the Board, Finance Committee and at the convocations of the Institute.

(2) It shall be the duty of the Chairperson to ensure that the decisions taken by the Board are implemented.

(3) The Chairperson shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him, by this Act or the Statutes.

Director.

23. (1) The Director shall be the principal executive officer of the Institute and shall be responsible for implementation of the decisions of the Board and Senate and for day-to-day administration of the Institute.

(2) The Director shall be appointed by the Visitor, on such terms and conditions of service as may be laid down by the Statutes.

(3) The Director shall be appointed out of the panel of names recommended by a search-cum selection committee consisting of—

(a) Chairperson of the Board, who shall be the Chairperson of the search-cum-selection committee;

(b) two members, nominated by the Board, from amongst eminent administrators, industrialists, educationists, scientists, technocrats and management specialists;

(c) nominee of the State Government in which the Institute is located;

(d) nominee of one of the industry partners by rotation;

(e) head of the Bureau, Ministry of Human Resource Development dealing with Indian Institutes of Information Technology—Member Secretary, *ex officio*;

(4) The Director shall exercise the powers and perform the duties as may be assigned under this Act or the Statutes or Ordinances, or as may be delegated by the Board.

(5) The Director shall, except on account of resignation or removal, hold office for a period of five years from the date of assumption of charge as Director.

(6) The Director may, by writing under his hand addressed to the Chairperson, resign his office.

(7) The Visitor may remove from office the Director, who—

(a) has been adjudged as insolvent; or

(b) has been convicted of an offence which, in the opinion of the Visitor, involves moral turpitude; or

(c) has become physically or mentally incapable of acting as a Director; or

(d) has acquired such financial or other interest as is likely to affect prejudicially the functions as a Director; or

(e) has so abused the position or so conducted as to render the continuance in office prejudicial to the public interest;

Provided that the Director shall not be removed from office except by an order made by the Visitor, after an enquiry instituted by the Board, in which the Director has been informed of the charges and given a reasonable opportunity of being heard in respect of those charges.

(8) The Board shall initiate the process of appointment in respect of any vacancy due to arise for the post of Director on completion of tenure before a period of six months from the date of arising of such vacancy and that the process of appointment shall be completed before such vacancy arises.

(9) Where the post of Director falls vacant on account of any reason other than completion of tenure, the process of appointment shall be initiated by the Board within one month of such vacancy and process shall be completed as early as possible.

24. (1) The Registrar of every Institute shall be appointed on such terms and conditions as may be laid down by the Statutes.

Registrar.

(2) The Registrar shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be assigned to him by the Statutes or by the Director.

(3) The Registrar shall be responsible to the Director for the proper discharge of his functions.

25. (1) The Institute shall, within five years from the date of establishment and incorporation under this Act and thereafter at the expiration of every fifth year, constitute,

Review of performance of Institute.

with the prior approval of the Board, a review committee or shall appoint an agency as a third party to evaluate the performance of the Institute and its achievements with respect to its objectives during the said period.

(2) The review committee constituted under sub-section (1) shall consist of members of repute in academia or industry, from relevant fields of teaching, learning and research in such Institute.

(3) The third party agency appointed under sub-section (1) shall have past experience of conducting such evaluations.

(4) The review committee or the third party agency, as the case may be, shall assess the performance of Institute and shall submit its report with recommendations on—

(a) the extent of fulfilment of the objects of the Institute mentioned in section 6, as demonstrated by the state of teaching, learning and research, and its contribution to the society;

(b) the promotion of transformational research and its impact on industry and society;

(c) the advancement of fundamental research beyond the current frontiers of knowledge;

(d) the establishment of the Institute as amongst the global leaders in the area of information technology;

(e) such other parameters as the Board may consider necessary and specify.

(5) The Board shall place the report of the review committee or the third party agency in the public domain and on its website and consider the recommendations referred to in sub-section (3) and take such action as it may deem fit.

Provided that the recommendations of the review committee or the third party agency along with an explanatory memorandum on the action taken or proposed to be taken, specifying the reasons thereof, shall be submitted to the Central Government.

CHAPTER IV

ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT

Grants by
Central
Government
and State
Governments.

26. (1) For the purposes of enabling the Institute to discharge their functions efficiently under this Act, the Central Government and the State Government may, after due appropriation made by the Parliament and the concerned State Legislature, as the case may be, by law in this behalf, pay to each Institute in every financial year such sums of money in such manner as is required to fulfil their obligations under section 11.

(2) The Central Government and the concerned State Government shall provide to each Institute, grants of such sums of money as are required to meet the expenditure on scholarships or fellowships instituted by it, including scholarships or fellowships for students from socially and educationally backward classes of citizens enrolled in such Institute.

Fund of
Institute.

27. (1) Every Institute shall maintain a Fund to which shall be credited

(a) all monies provided by the Central Government or the State Government or industry partner, as the case may be;

(b) all fees and other charges received by the Institute from students;

(c) all monies received by the Institute by way of grants, gifts, donations, benefactions, bequests or transfers;

(d) all monies received by the Institute from utilisation of intellectual property

arising from research conducted or provision of advisory or consultancy services by it; and

(c) all monies received by the Institute in any other manner or from any other source.

(2) The Fund of every Institute shall be applied towards meeting the expenses of the Institute including expenses incurred in the exercise of its powers and discharge of its duties under this Act, furtherance of research in the Institute or in collaboration with other educational institutions or industry and for capital investment aimed at the growth and development of the Institute.

(3) All monies credited to the Fund of every Institute shall be deposited in such banks or invested in such manner as the Institute may, with approval of the Board, decide.

(4) Each Institute shall create a corpus fund for long term sustainability of the Institute, to which shall be credited such per cent. of the net income of the Institute and donations made specifically towards such corpus fund as the Central Government may, in accordance with the provisions of the Income-tax Act, 1961, notify:

Provided that the Board may also create endowment funds for specific purpose to which donations may be specifically made.

28. (7) Every Institute shall maintain proper accounts and other relevant records and prepare annual statement of accounts including the balance sheet in such form and accounting standard as may be specified by notification, by the Central Government in consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India.

Accounts and audit.

(2) Where the statement of income and expenditure and the balance sheet of the Institute do not comply with the accounting standards, the Institute shall disclose in its statement of income and expenditure and balance sheet, the following, namely:

- (a) the deviation from the accounting standards;
- (b) the reasons for such deviation; and
- (c) the financial effect, if any, arising out due to such deviation.

(3) The accounts of every Institute shall be audited by the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India or any other person in accordance with the provisions of the extant rules and any expenditure incurred by audit team in connection with such audit shall be payable by the Institute to the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India or such person.

(4) The Comptroller and Auditor-General of India and any person appointed in connection with the audit of the accounts of any Institute shall have the same rights, privileges and authority in connection with such audit as the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India has in connection with the audit of the Government accounts and, in particular shall have the rights to demand the production of books, accounts, connected vouchers and other documents and papers and to inspect the offices of the Institute.

(5) The accounts of every Institute as certified by the Comptroller and Auditor-General of India or any other person appointed in this behalf together with the audit report thereon shall be forwarded annually to the Central Government.

29. Every Institute may constitute for the benefit of its employees such provident or pension fund or provide such insurance scheme as it may deem fit in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be laid down by the Statutes.

Pension and provident fund.

30. All appointments of the staff of every Institute, except that of the Director, shall be made in accordance with the procedure laid down in the Statutes.

Appointments.

31. Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:

Statutes.

- (a) the formation of departments of teaching;

(b) the institution of fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, medals and prizes;

(c) the terms of office and the method of appointment of officers of the Institute;

(d) the qualifications of teachers of the Institute;

(e) the classification, method of appointment and the determination of the terms and conditions of service of teachers and other staff of the Institute;

(f) the constitution of pension, insurance and provident funds for the benefit of the officers, teachers and other staff of the Institute as per the provisions existing from time to time;

(g) the constitution, powers and duties of the authorities of the Institute;

(h) the establishment and maintenance of halls and hostels;

(i) the conditions of residence of students of the Institute and the levying of fees for residence in the halls and hostels and of other charges;

(j) the allowances to be paid to the Chairperson and members of the Board;

(k) the authentication of the orders and decisions of the Board;

(l) the meetings of the Board, the Senate, or any committee, the quorum at such meetings and the procedure to be followed in the conduct of their business; and

(m) any other matter as may be considered necessary for the efficient functioning of the Institute.

Statutes may
to be made.

32. (1) The first Statute of each Institute shall be framed by the Board with the prior approval of the Visitor.

(2) The Board may, from time to time, make new or additional Statutes or may amend or repeal the Statutes.

Ordinances.

33. Subject to the provisions of this Act and the Statutes, the Ordinances of every Institute may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:—

(a) the admission of the students to the Institute;

(b) the courses of study to be laid down for all degrees and diplomas of the Institute;

(c) the conditions under which students shall be admitted to the degree or diploma courses and to the examinations of the Institute, and shall be eligible for degrees and diplomas;

(d) the conditions of award of the fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, medals and prizes;

(e) the conditions and mode of appointment and duties of examining bodies, examiners and moderators;

(f) the conduct of examinations;

(g) the maintenance of discipline among the students of the Institute; and

(h) any other matter which by this Act or the Statutes is to be or may be provided for by the Ordinances.

Ordinances
to be
made.

34. (1) Save as otherwise provided in this section, Ordinances shall be made by the Senate.

(2) All Ordinances made by the Senate shall have effect from such date as it may direct, but every Ordinance so made shall be submitted, as soon as may be, to the Board and shall be considered by the Board at its next meeting.

(3) The Board shall have power by resolution to modify or cancel any such Ordinance and such Ordinance shall from the date of such resolution stand modified accordingly or cancelled, as the case may be.

35. (1) (a) Any dispute arising out of a contract between an Institute and any of its employees shall, at the request of the employer concerned or at the instance of the Institute, be referred to a Tribunal of Arbitration consisting of one member appointed by the Institute, one member nominated by the employee, and an umpire appointed by the Visitor.

Tribunal of Arbitration.

(b) The decision of the Tribunal shall be final and shall not be questioned in any court.

(c) No suit or proceeding shall lie in any court in respect of any matter, which is required by sub-section (1) to be referred to the Tribunal of Arbitration.

(d) The Tribunal of Arbitration shall have power to regulate its own procedure:

Provided that the Tribunal shall have regard to the principles of natural justice while making such procedure.

(e) Nothing in any law for the time being in force relating to arbitration shall apply to arbitrations under this section.

(2) Any student or candidate for an examination whose name has been removed from the rolls of the Institute by the orders or resolution of the Director of the Institute and who has been debarred from appearing at the examinations of the Institute for more than one year, may within ten days of the date of receipt of such resolution by him, appeal to the Board who may confirm, modify or reverse the decision of the Director.

(3) Any dispute arising out of any disciplinary action taken by the Institute against a student shall, at the request of such student, be referred to a Tribunal of Arbitration and the provisions of sub-section (1) shall, as far as may be, apply to a reference made under this sub-section.

(4) Every employee or student of the Institute, notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, have a right to appeal within such time as may be laid down by the Statutes, to the Board of Governors against the decision of any officer or authority of the Institute, as the case may be, and thereupon the Board may confirm, modify or reverse the decision appealed against.

36. (1) There shall be attached to every statement of accounts laid before the Board of each Institute, a report by its Director, with respect to—

Annual report of Director.

(a) the state of affairs of such Institute;

(b) the amount, if any, which it proposes to carry forward to any surplus reserves in its balance sheet;

(c) the extent to which understatement or overstatement of any surplus of income over expenditure or any shortfall of expenditure over income has been indicated in the auditor's report and the reasons for such understatement or overstatement;

(d) the productivity of research projects undertaken by the Institute measured in accordance with such norms as may be specified by any statutory regulatory authority;

(e) appointments of the officers and teachers of the Institute;

(f) benchmark and internal standards set by the Institute, including the nature of innovations in teaching, research and application of knowledge.

(2) The Director shall also be bound to give the complete information and explanation in its report on every reservation, qualification or adverse remark contained in the auditors' report.

Annual report
of each
Institute.

37. (1) The annual report of each Institute shall be prepared under the direction of the Board, which shall include, among other matters, the steps taken by the Institute towards the fulfilment of its objects and an outcome based assessment of the research being undertaken in such Institute, and be submitted to the Board on or before such date as may be specified and the Board shall consider the report in its annual meeting.

(2) The annual report as approved by the Board shall be published and placed on the website of the Institute.

(3) The Board shall prepare and release for every year a report, in English and in Hindi, the working of the Institute in the previous year on or before the expiry of nine months from the close of financial year, and a copy of the same, together with an audited statement of accounts showing the income and expenditure for the previous year shall be submitted to the Central Government and the concerned State Government within that stipulated time, and the same may be caused to be laid before each House of Parliament and the concerned State Legislature.

CHAPTER V

Co-ordination Forum

Co-ordination
Forum

38. (1) In order that there may be better co-ordination among the Institutes, the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, establish, with effect from such date as may be specified in the notification, a central body to be called the Co-ordination Forum for all the Institutes specified in column (5) of the Schedule.

(2) The Co-ordination Forum shall consist of the following members, namely:—

(i) the Minister in-charge of the Ministry or Department of the Central Government having administrative control of technical education, *ex officio*, as Chairperson;

(ii) Secretary to the Government of India, in-charge of the Department of the Central Government having administrative control of technical education, *ex officio*;

(iii) four Secretaries in-charge of department looking after Indian Institutes of Information Technology of State Governments in which the Institutes are located, to be nominated by the Chairperson of the Co-ordination Forum, by rotation for two years, *ex officio*;

(iv) four Chairpersons of the Institutes, to be nominated by the Chairperson of the Co-ordination Forum, by rotation for two years;

(v) the Directors of each of the Institutes, *ex officio*;

(vi) four industry partners, to be nominated by the Chairperson of the Co-ordination Forum, not more than one from any Institute, by rotation every two years;

(vii) three persons of eminence, of which at least one shall be a woman, in academia, industry or public service, to be nominated by the Co-ordination Forum; and

(viii) one representative of All India Council of Technical Education;

Provided that while nominating under clauses (iii), (iv) and (vi), care shall be taken to ensure representation of as many Institutes as possible by selecting Secretaries of State Governments, Chairpersons of the Institutes, and representatives of industry partners from the Board of different Institutes to the extent possible.

(3) An officer of the Department of Higher Education, Government of India, not below the rank of Joint Secretary, concerned with technical education, *ex officio*, to act as the Member-Secretary of the Co-ordination Forum.

(4) The Co-ordination Forum may, at its discretion, constitute a Standing Committee of the Indian Institute of Information Technology Co-ordination Forum (Public private Partnership) to assist the Co-ordination Forum in discharge of its duties and responsibilities.

(5) The expenditure on the Co-ordination Forum shall be met by the resources pooled by all the Institutes governed by this Act.

39. (1) The term of office of a member referred to in clause (viii) of sub-section (2) of section 38 shall be three years from the date of nomination.

(2) The term of office of an *ex officio* member shall continue so long as the member holds the office by virtue of which he is a member.

(3) While nominating members to the Co-ordination Forum under clauses (iii), (iv) and (v) of sub-section (2) of section 38, the Chairperson of the Co-ordination Forum shall, to the extent possible, ensure maximum possible representation from each Institute.

(4) The members of the Co-ordination Forum shall be entitled to travelling and such other allowances, as may be prescribed, for attending meetings of the Co-ordination Forum or its Committees thereat.

40. (1) The Co-ordination Forum shall facilitate the sharing of experience, ideas and concerns with a view to enhancing the performance of all the Institutes.

(2) Without prejudice to the provisions of sub-section (1), the Co-ordination Forum shall perform the following functions, namely:—

(a) advise the Central Government to include a new institution or exclude an existing institution from the Schedule;

(b) deliberate on such matters of common interest to Institutes as may be referred to it by any Institute;

(c) promote necessary co-ordination and co-operation in the working of the Institutes;

(d) recommend to the Central Government, the institution of scholarships including for research and for the benefit of students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and other socially and educationally backward classes of citizens; and

(e) perform such other functions as may be referred to it by the Central Government or any State Government.

Provided that nothing in this section shall derogate the powers and functions vested by law in the Board or Senate or other authorities of each Institute.

(3) The Chairperson of the Co-ordination Forum shall ordinarily preside at the meetings of the Co-ordination Forum and in the absence, the Secretary to the Government of India, in-charge of the Department of the Central Government having administrative control of technical education, shall preside at the meeting.

(4) The Co-ordination Forum shall meet at least once in every year, or as and when deemed necessary by the Chairperson of the Co-ordination Forum, and follow such procedure in its meetings, as may be prescribed.

Term of office and allowances payable to members of Co-ordination Forum.

Functions and duties of Co-ordination Forum.

CHAPTER VI

MISCELLANEOUS

Power to
make rules

41. (1) The Central Government may, after previous publication, by notification make rules for carrying out the provisions of this Act.

(2) In particular, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such rules may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:—

(a) the form and manner in which the State Government shall submit proposal to the Central Government under sub-section (2) of section 11;

(b) the investment proposal of capital in establishment of the Institute and the respective shares under sub-section (7) of section 11;

(c) the travelling and other allowances payable to members of the Co-ordination Forum under sub-section (4) of section 39;

(d) the procedure to be followed in the meetings of the Co-ordination Forum under sub-section (4) of section 40.

Acts and

42. No act of the Co-ordination Forum, or any Institute or Board or Senate or any other body set up under this Act or the Statutes, shall be invalid merely by reason of—

(a) any vacancy or defect in the constitution thereof; or

(b) any irregularity in its procedure not affecting the merits of the case; or

(c) any defect in the selection, nomination or appointment of a person acting as a member thereof.

Returns and
information to

43. (1) The Institute shall furnish to the Central Government such returns or other information with respect to its policies or activities as the Central Government may, for the purpose of reporting to Parliament or for the making of policy, from time to time require.

(2) The Institute, shall furnish to the State Government in which such Institute is located, such returns or other information with respect to its policies or activities as that Government may, for the purpose of reporting to the concerned State Legislature or for the making of policy, from time to time require.

Power of

44. The Institute shall carry out such directions as may be issued to it from time to time by the Central Government for the efficient administration of this Act.

45. The provisions of the Right to Information Act, 2005 shall apply to each Institute, as if it were a public authority defined in clause (b) of section 2 of the Right to Information Act, 2005.

Transitional

46. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act—

(1) (a) the Board of every Institute functioning as such immediately before the commencement of this Act shall continue to function until a new Board is constituted for that Institute under this Act, but on the constitution of a new Board under this Act, the members of the Board holding office before such commencement of this Act shall cease to hold office;

(b) every Senate constituted in relation to every Institute before the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to be the Senate constituted under this Act until a Senate is constituted under this Act for that Institute, but on the constitution of the new Senate under this Act, the members of the Senate holding office before the commencement of this Act shall cease to hold office;

(c) rules, bye-laws and Ordinances of each existing Institute as in force, immediately, before the commencement of this Act, shall continue to apply in the corresponding institute in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, until the first Statutes and Ordinances are made under this Act;

(d) in case there are no such rules, bye-laws or Ordinances, the Statutes, Ordinances, rules and regulations of one of the existing centrally funded Indian Institutes of Information Technology as adopted by the Board of the concerned Institute, shall apply to the Institute in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of the Act until the first Statutes and the Ordinances are made under this Act.

(2) The Central Government may, without prejudice to the provisions of sub-section (f), if it considers necessary and expedient to do so, by notification, take such measures which may be necessary for the transfer of the existing Institute to the corresponding Institute mentioned under column (5) of the Schedule.

47. (f) If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Central Government may, by order published in the Official Gazette, make such provisions or give such directions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as appears to it to be necessary or expedient for removing the difficulty:

Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of the period of three years from the date of commencement of this Act.

(2) Every order made under this section shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before each House of Parliament.

48. Every rule, Statute, Ordinance made, and every notification issued, by the Central Government under this Act, shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made or issued, before each House of Parliament, while it is in session, for a total period of thirty days which may be comprised in one session or in two or more successive sessions, and if, before the expiry of the session immediately following the session or the successive sessions aforesaid, both Houses agree in making any modification in the rule, Statute, Ordinance or notification or both Houses agree that the rule, Statute, Ordinance or notification should not be made or issued, the rule, Statute, Ordinance or notification shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be; so, however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule, Statute, Ordinance or notification.

Item No. 1: To confirm the Minutes of the Fifth Meeting of the Governing Body held on June 13, 2016

The Governing Body confirmed the Minutes of the Fifth Meeting.

Item No. 2: To report the Action Taken on the Minutes of the Fifth Meeting of the Governing Body held on June 13, 2016

The Governing Body took note of the Action Taken Report.

Item No. 3:

- (a) **To review the progress of the ongoing constructions work as per approved building plan and map.**

The Governing Body took note of the progress of ongoing construction and emphasized the need to push the pace of construction so that it can be finished within stipulated time.

- (b) **To consider the request of M/s UPRNN Limited regarding approval of PMC Charges**

The matter was deliberated by the Governing Body. Secretary State, Technical Education State Govt informed the members that for similar works, 12.5% charges are being claimed by UPRNN. After a detailed discussion and looking into how PMC charges are processed at other IITs or IITs, it was resolved to accept the proposed 5% PMC Charges+ 1.5% architectural charges.

- (c) **To consider the revised estimate submitted by M/s Uttar Pradesh Rajkiya Nirman Nigam Limited, Lucknow, Project Monitoring Consultant (PMC) of the construction works of IIT-PPP, Lucknow**

The Governing body resolved that the revised estimate should be relooked again meticulously by the Committee consisting of Mentor Director, representative of State Govt, GM UPRNN, Architect and other Civil Engineer expert either from IIT Kanpur or MNNIT Allahabad. The land filling proposal also needs to be rechecked by the same group.

Item No. 4: **To apprise the hiring of temporary premises nearby Lucknow,**

The Board did not approve the proposal to hire the premises in Lucknow. However, underscoring the space problem faced by IIT Allahabad and also understanding the importance to allow IITL to develop and grow on its own, the Governing body resolved that efforts should be made to start classes in some hired premises in Allahabad or any other nearby place till the regular building is available. Towards this, the Board also resolved to increase the intake of students and expand the courses, further the Board desired that the efforts should be made to open minimum two or more branches and to increase the intake of students to 250 over next 2-3 years.

Item No. 5: **To approve initial requirement of various Teaching and Non-Teaching positions for IIT-PPP, Lucknow campus**

The Governing Body resolved that sanctioned post in the ratio of 12:1:1.1 should be sanctioned on the total present strength of the students.

Report of the First Visit of the Co-ordination Committee for IIT, Lucknow to Lucknow on 16/10/2017

The members who visited were as follows:-

- 1) Prof. Anupam, Prof. In Charge, IIT Lucknow
- 2) Dr. Ashutosh Mishra
- 3) Dr. Asheesh Kumar, Interim Registrar, IIT Lucknow

During the visit the members undertook two activities, namely:

- 1) Review of the ongoing Construction Works at Chak Ganjeria, the permanent site of IIT Lucknow (Detailed in Part - I of the Report)
- 2) Explored the possibility of having IIT Lucknow housed in an alternate temporary site, till the permanent site is readied and made occupiable (Detailed in Part - II of the Report).

Part-I : Review of the ongoing Construction Works at Chak Ganjeria

(The report consists of details on Construction Activity(A), Financial Situation (B), Decisions required (C&F), Big Picture (D), etc.)

The members visited the project site at Chak Ganjeria Farms, Sultanpur Road, Lucknow and met Project Manager M/s UPRNN Project Monitoring Consultancy (PMC) of IIT-Lucknow alongwith his team. The members also took round of the ongoing construction buildings and observed as follows:-

A. Construction related observations

1. For First Phase following buildings were approved for construction, are as follows:-

(i)	Academic Block (G+6)	-	Area=22,500 sqm
(ii)	Administrative Block (G+4)	-	Area=1,875 sqm
(iii)	Hostel Block (G+5) 3 Bedded	-	Area=839 Sqm

Against the above, tenders were invited by UPRNN for construction of Academic Block only and accordingly the work was awarded to M/s U.P. Developers for constructing the Academic Block comprising of 22,500 sqm at the cost of Rs. 4911.77 Lakhs (Say Rs. 49.12 Crores)

2. While constructing the Academic Building, it was observed by the PMC (UPRNN) that Academic Building and Administrative Building were so structurally connected that construction of Academic Block alone in isolation was not possible. Therefore, it became imperative that UPRNN undertake the construction of Academic Block in conjunction with the Administrative Block i.e. for Total area 22,500 + 1,875 = 24,375 sqm.
3. It is pertinent to mention that when the initial concept of the campus was designed, it was more of "Horizontal" lay-out pattern which was later transformed into a "Vertical" campus lay-out pattern with a view to economize on land space, in view of provision for future expansion.
4. While affecting this transition from "Horizontal" to "Vertical" pattern and keeping the academic areas like class rooms, seminar rooms of constant size, the area in vertically patterned building increased by about 8.63% (from 24,375 sqm to 26,479.30 sqm.) on account of provisions required for Fire Escapes, Lifts and Stairs etc.

5. Also, though work for construction of Academic Building only was tendered and awarded by UPRNN to M/s U.P. Developers for 22,500 sqm, the drawings which were approved in various Governing Body meetings were approved for total plinth area of 26,479.30 sqm, where Administrative Block was G+4 storied and Academic Block G+6 storied.
6. In view of the above at present the construction of consolidated Academic and Administrative Block is in progress. In the same the roof slab of 2nd Floor of Admin Building and Academic Building are under the casting stage. Work of the hostel building has been completed upto the plinth level.
7. As on date Rs. 27 Crores only has been received by UPRNN towards this project and they are lagging by about 15 Crores as unpaid bills to the contractor. On account of the same, the work of construction was also held up on site for few months which has been requested by the Institute to be resumed.

B. Finances related observations

1. Against the sanctioned cost for First Phase (comprising of Academic cum Admin Block + One Hostel Building) for Rs. 72 Crores, a sum of Rs. 27 Crores only has been received by UPRNN so far.
2. Additional Rs. 15 Crores that were sanctioned by the Institute to UPRNN have not yet reached UPRNN because of confusion over the authorized signatories.
3. It is however also learnt that concurrently, for future transactions, the Governing Body of IIT-L in its 6th meeting of 05/10/2017 vide Agenda Item No. 11 has resolved that only one consolidated account of IIT-L should be maintained and that too at Allahabad with the Mentor Director and The Registrar, as its signatories.

After this is effected, (Consequent upon the approval of Minutes of 6th Meeting of Governing Body) then only the funds would effectively reach UPRNN. This is likely to take about two months' time.

4. Against the above backdrop, analysis of funds was undertaken by the Co-ordination Committee and it was observed as follows:-

For Phase-I works at the sanctioned cost of Rs. 72 Crores approx, the proportionate sums of money to be received from the three partners collaborating in PPP mode viz. Central Government (50%), State Government (35%) and Industry Partner (15%) following funds were received (towards building construction)

5. In view of the above, it appears reasonable to recommend to the Institute to request the Central Government and State Government partners to immediately release their balance portions of funds as follows:-

Central Government	-	Rs. 19.56 Crores
State Government	-	Rs. 6.94 Crores

- C. In light of the A & B above, the meeting with Sh. S.C. Rai, GM, Lucknow Zone-1, UPRNN was also undertaken during the visit. After intense deliberations, it was observed that UPRNN was ready to handover the first phase works in completed shape by June, 2018, PROVIDED

- (a) Full money (i.e. Rs. 72 Crores) for Phase-I works is transferred to UPRNN latest by December, 2017.

- (b) Clarifications on few drawings are made available to UPRNN, in parallel.
- (c) Explicit permission be granted to UPRNN to go ahead with the construction of 26,479.30 sqm. at the total cost of Rs 61.21 Crores in lieu of 24,375 sqm. area proposed earlier at the cost of Rs. 52.92 Crores. Also appropriate sanctions & sums of money for other associated works as per D below would be required.

(Imp - The current rates and Rupees figures shall remain valid only until June 2018, after which the cost escalation shall be allowable to the contractor).

- E. Competent authority may like to decide as to what is to be included and what is to be excluded from the present scope of works in light of the funds availability vis-a-vis the cost of the various provisions.

Part-II : Exploring the housing of IIT Lucknow at an alternative Temporary Site at Lucknow

Against the backdrop of the decision of the Governing Body, w.r.t. Agenda item no.4 of its 6th Meeting, to explore the possibility of housing IIT Lucknow at an alternative temporary site, till the permanent site of the Institute is ready, the Co-ordination Committee, explored two options, as follows:

Option 1 - With prior information that AKTU University (The erstwhile UP Technical University), had moved out of its temporary site at IET Lucknow, after vacating the IET premises, recently, to its permanent site, the members thought it fit to explore the possibility of using the same vacated place in IET, for use by IIT Lucknow temporarily.


With this in mind, the members visited the AKTU vacated site at IET Lucknow. Upon visit, it was observed that in the vacated space, while two rooms had so far been occupied by the Administrative Officers of IET, others rooms had though been allocated to different departments, were yet to be occupied. Though the space in the said premises appeared to be usable for academic purposes, for Laboratory spaces, IITL would still have to depend upon IET for using their labs on time sharing basis, may be against some suitable compensation. Use of IET premises as a temporary site would though facilitate in hiring of part time Faculty BUT hostel accommodation was not available on the IET campus, which was almost as important. Presently, to shift all IIT L students from IIT Allahabad to Lucknow, would require hostel space for 111 boys and 26 Girls (Total strength of presently enrolled three batches).

Further, IET being located in a well populated locality, possibility of having a compact hostel type accommodation premises outside IET premises, but nearby, was remote and if at all available, would be extremely expensive (in view of the limited budget available with IIT L- PPP Mode).

Option 2 - Ideally, the temporary site should be a unified site where Classroom, Lab, Office and hostel space, all should be available in a unified fashion or at best in close, unhindered and safe proximity. This could be possible at any of such Private Engineering College / Diploma College, who presently was not finding it feasible to run. During past year there were newspaper reports that owing to various reasons, some Private Engineering Colleges in the state were unable to attract good number of students, which led to the seats remaining vacant and now compelling the promoters to shut down their operations.


To explore the possibility of such an Institutional premises, Institute may think of giving out an advertisement calling for "Expression of Interest" from such promoters from Lucknow. Better still, if this was close to the permanent location - Chak Ganjeria, Lucknow-Sultanpur Road.

Competent authority may therefore like to be apprised and take its call accordingly, both in respect of Part-I as well as Part-II, above.





Minutes of the First Meeting of the Senate of IIT, Lucknow held on 22.11.2017 from 03:30 P.M. onwards in the Meeting Room of Admin Block, IIT-A

The Chairman welcomed the members present and called upon them to rededicate themselves towards taking IIT Lucknow to newer heights. After brief discussions on various developments, the Chairman brought the meeting to order wherein, following were discussed and resolved:-

Item 1: To discuss the applicability of the courses, course contents and examination system as applicable to IIT Lucknow students.

The members observed that currently the 3rd batch of IIT Lucknow students (comprising of 111 boys and 26 girls) were studying at IIT Allahabad. These were spread over 3 semesters namely 1st Semester, 3rd Semester and 5th Semester of 4 years B.Tech (IT) Program. So far they have been mentored at IIT-A as per the courses, course contents and examination system as prevalent in IIT-A and applicable to IIT students.

Against the above backdrop, the members resolved to continue with the existing courses, course contents and examination system as prevailing at IIT-A until of fresh decision in this respect is taken by the Senate of IIT Lucknow. As an interim arrangement Dr. Ashutosh Mishra was entrusted with the responsibility of coordinating examination of IIT Lucknow.


Item 2: To decide upon the Ordinances to regulate the academic activities of IIT Lucknow students.

The members resolved to adopt the prevailing Ordinances of IIT Allahabad till the Institute had its own Ordinances in place.

Item 3: To decide upon the matter of issuance of Identity Card/Grade Cards etc. to the students of IIT Lucknow

After deliberations, it was resolved that all such identification/certification should be made under the name of "IIT Lucknow" alongwith a statement as "Mentor Campus at IIT Allahabad"

For the purpose of issuance of ID Cards/Grade Card separate arrangements for procurement of appropriate ID Cards making hardware and software may accordingly be done. The same may remain the property of IIT Lucknow and be transferred to it, as and when the students move out.



Item 4: To consider about the nominations u/s 18 (1) (f) of IIT-PPP, Act 2017

In the context, the members considered the proposal made by Prof, Anupam and then resolved upon the following nominations:-

1. Prof. T. Lahiri (Currently Dean Academic & Research, IIT-A)
2. Prof. Raghuraj Singh (Former Director, KNTI Sultanpur and currently Professor of Computer Science , HBTU, Kanpur)
3. Prof S P Tripathi (Currently Professor of Computer Science, I.E.T., Lucknow.

Item 5: To discuss the appointment of Faculty to handle current academic activities of IIT Lucknow.

The members observed that in one of the earlier meetings of the Co-ordination Committee , it had resolved as follows:-

"Advertisement for hiring of suitable Faculty on eleven month contract should be brought out. Ph.D. completed candidates should be preferred. While M.Tech passed with Ph.D. pursuing candidates, may be considered if and only if, suitable Ph.D. candidates are not found available. Remuneration details may be worked out by the co-ordination committee after seeing the same as being offered in the nearby institutions like MNNIT (For Guest Faculty) and IITA (for TRA etc.). Both on all consolidated basis. About 2-5 Faculty members may be hired. The offer shall be for IIT Lucknow with no bearing on IIT Allahabad and without any commitment of permanency at IIT Lucknow either. The recruitments may ideally be over within December 2018. PI/c IIT Lucknow to put up the draft advertisement to the Mentor Director latest by 20/11/2017 for its approval."


The Senate ratified the same. Also in respect of procurement of 140 Laptops, the Senate desired that the same may be procured at the earliest.

- ii) To consider any further expansion of courses only after the Institute moved to its permanent site at Lucknow.



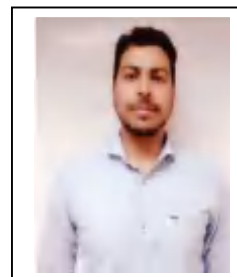

Both the boys and girls hostels provide all the possible facilities like common halls, washing machines, Night canteens and what not making the life of students quite comfortable.

ii. Permanent Campus & Construction related chronology

The permanent campus of IIIT, Lucknow is coming up in 50 acres of land at Chak Ganjaria Region, Lucknow. The Institute is being set up with the financial contributions of MHRD, Govt. of India, Govt. of Uttar Pradesh, and U. P. Electronics Corporation Ltd. as industry partner. It is a couple of kilometers away from the International cricket stadium (along with many other sports facilities) which is being set up in Gomti Nagar extension.

The institute is surrounded by a 100 Acre IT City SEZ Lucknow project which is being developed by HCL Group. The IT city will provide direct employment to 25,000 with indirect employment to approx. 50,000 people.

Any escalation in capital cost will be borne by the private partner(s).

3. During the initial period of setting up, each IIT will be given a total of Rs. 10.00 crores to meet its operating expenses. Each IIT is expected to become financially self-sufficient and able to meet its entire operating expenditure (Opex) without any support from the Central or State Govt within five years of its commencing operations.

JUSTIFICATION REPORT

Name of Work :- Revised estimate for construction of First Phase Construction of IIT-PPP, Lucknow at Chak Ganjeria Farms, Lucknow

Preamble :- M/s UPRNN submitted its initial estimate of Rs. 21470.35 lakhs on 30.01.2014 for the plinth area of approx. 70000 sqm on the basis of circle rates of U.P. Lok Nirman Vibhag effective from 01.08.2013. Later, M/s UPRNN submitted its revised estimate vide letter no. 630/म. प्र. (सक.)/आगणकारागिनि/2014 on 05.02.2014 of Rs. 15705.72 lakhs on the area approved in DPR i.e. for 55000 sqm. After approval of the committee the total cost for the above estimate was approved for Rs. 14416.33 lakhs vide letter no. 791/सोलह-1-2014-9 (बजट-4)/2014 dated 18.06.2014.

After approving the lay out and maps M/s UPRNN was nominated as Project Monitoring Consultancy (PMC) vide letter no. 856/सोलह-1-2014-14(5)/2013 टीसी/1 dated 10.06.2015. It was proposed to have an academic building and a hostel during first phase of construction and it was directed to execute the above work on tender basis. Subsequently, tenders were invited by M/s UPRNN on the basis of approved estimate and the bid of M/s U.P. Developers was found lowest. The Governing Body of IIT- Lucknow in its 5th meeting held on 13.06.2016 gave its consent to execute the above work from the lowest bidder and governmental vide its letter dated 11.8.2016 gave its approval to start the above work. In compliance of the same, the construction works of first phase started on 01.09.2016

Justification for revision:- The estimate was based on the plinth area rate of the year 2013 on the basis of D.P.R. provided by the State Govt. in which Academic, Administrative and Hostel buildings were proposed upto third floor. Later, on the directions of Governing Body, the building were converted into multi storied buildings and after soil inspections from the structural consultant, the provision for pile foundation was made.

The land of Chak Ganjeria became low lying upto approx. 2.20 meter from the road due to development of Chak Ganjeria farms so the plinth of the building was also required to be increase by 2.20 meter. Consequently the water logging problem has arisen. Hence, earth filling becomes inevitable for proper drainage.

After discussion with the architect and authorities of IIT Lucknow, it was decided to do the minimum work of earth filling by approx. 1.20 meters to avoid water logging problem and also for proper drainage, the boundary wall of the campus was also to be built like retaining wall due to earth filling work. Initially, the height of boundary wall was taken as 1.80 meter but in view of location of the campus, total height of the boundary wall has become 4.00 meter. Thus, the total cost of the boundary wall has increased substantially due to piling works and its conversion into retaining wall.

In view of the above, the Governing Body is requested to consider the changes in the earlier provision of first phase considering the maps and actual geographical location of the land.

Payment to Forest Department:- Besides this removal of Babool and other plants was also required so the forest department gave its estimate which is also included in revised estimate.

In addition to above, earth filling works and provisions of all conditions were also made as per the directions of the HIT-Lucknow vide Letter F. No. HIT-A/ODIR/HIT-L/0187/2017 dated 30.06.2017.

Rates :- In the revised estimate for the first phase of constructions, the rates are taken from the Plinth Area Rate of Lok Nirman Vibhag as the tenders were invited on the rates of 2013. The rates which are not available in Lok Nirman Vibhag have been taken from DSR- 2013 and the rates which were not available in DSR - 2013 have been taken on the basis of minimum market rate.

Cost :- According to the original approved estimate, provisions for 2% contingency, 6.5 % PMC charges and 1 % Labour Cess had been made. Now as per applicability of GST, provision of 18% GST has also been made in for balance amount to be paid to M/s UPRNN. The implication of GST is increasing the cost by Rs. 1929.62 lakhs.

Thus, including all above head, the revised estimated cost of first phase comes to Rs. 15435.74 lakhs which is being submitted for administrative and financial approval.

प्रस्तावना :- धक गजरिया फार्म, लखनऊ में भारतीय सूचना प्रौद्योगिकी संस्थान (आईआईटी आईसी) के निर्माण हेतु शासन के पत्रांक-2483/संलह-1-2013-14 (05)/2013 दिनांक 11.10.2013 के द्वारा निर्माण निगम को कार्यदायी संस्था नामित किया गया। शासन के पत्रांक-228/संलह-2-2014-14(05)/2013 दि. 24.01.14 के द्वारा प्रस्तावित आईआईटीआईसी के निर्माण कार्य का प्रारम्भिक आगणन उपलब्ध करने हेतु निगम को निर्देशित किया गया। शासन के उक्त पत्र के अनुपालन में कार्य का प्रारम्भिक आगणन उ०प्र० लोक निर्माण विभाग की दि० 01.08.2013 से प्रभावी कुर्र्मी क्षेत्रफल 400 पर गठित कर रु० 2147035 लाख का पत्र संख्या-102/म०प्र० (ल०आ०-1)/जी-36/सनिनि/14, दिनांक 30.01.2014 के द्वारा शासन को प्रेषित किया गया जिसका कुल प्लिथ एरिया लगभग 70000 वर्ग मीटर था। प्राथमिक शिक्षा विभाग/शासन द्वारा वांछना की गयी थी कि उक्त कार्य का प्रारम्भिक आगणन परियोजना की डी०पी०आर० में अनुमोदित प्लिथ एरिया 55000 वर्ग मीटर तथा अनुमोदित लागत के अनुसार गठित कर पुनः प्रेषित किया जाये। अतः DPR में लिए गये प्लिथ एरिया के अनुसार प्रारम्भिक आगणन को संशोधित करते हुए रु० 15703.72 लाख का आगणन पत्रांक-630/म०प्र०(ल०आ०)/आगणन/सनिनि/2014, दिनांक 05.02.2014 द्वारा शासन को प्रेषित किया गया। उक्त प्रारम्भिक आगणन का कार्य सनिनि के अनुमोदनीपत्रांक सं० 14416.33 लाख की मूल स्वीकृति शासनादेश संख्या 791/संलह-1-2014-9(बजट-1)/2014, दिनांक 18.06.2014 के द्वारा प्रदान की गयी।

शासन के पत्रांक 856/संलह-1-2015-14(5)/2013 टीसी/1 दि० 10.06.2015 के द्वारा संशोधित ले-आउट प्लान तथा मानचित्रों पर अनुमोदन प्रदान करते हुए उ०प्र०सि०नि०नि०नि० को Project Monitoring Consultant (PMC) नामित किया गया तथा प्रथम चरण में एकेडमिक भवन एवं एक हॉस्टल के निर्माण प्रस्तावित किया गया तथा प्रथम फेज के कार्यों को निविदा के माध्यम से करवाने हेतु निर्देशित किया गया। उक्त के क्रम में उ०प्र०सि०नि०नि०नि० द्वारा प्रथम फेज के कार्यों हेतु स्वीकृत आगणन के सापेक्ष एकेडमिक भवन तथा एक हॉस्टल भवन एवं सांस्थित बाह्य स्थान विकास के कार्य हेतु निविदा आमंत्रित की गई जिसमें मेरार्ज दू०पी० डेवलपर्स की निविदा प्रस्तावत पाई गई। इसका प्रस्ताव डी०पी०आईसी के सक्षम प्रस्तुत किया गया डी०पी०आईसी की पंचम बैठक जो दि० 13.06.2016 को सम्पन्न हुई में उक्त कार्य को न्यूनतम निविदादाता से कार्य करवाने की सत्मति प्रदान की गई जिसे शासन के पत्र सं०-3226/संलह-1-2016-8(बजट-2), दि० 11.08.2016 द्वारा कार्य करवाने हेतु अनुमति प्रदान की गई। उक्त के परिपेक्ष में दि० 01.09.2016 से कार्य प्रारम्भ करना निर्देशित किया है।

पुनरीक्षित करने का औचित्य:- उपरोक्त कार्य का आगणन वर्ष 2013 के प्लिथ एरिया रेट पर स्वीकृत किया गया था जो कि शासन द्वारा उपलब्ध कराये गये डी०पी०आर० पर आधारित था। जिसमें एकेडमिक, एडमिनिस्ट्रेटिव, हॉस्टल भवन तीन चरण हेतु ही प्रस्तावित थे। दि० 03.11.14 को BOC द्वारा दिये गये निर्देशों के क्रम में भवना का बहुमंडिला कर दिया गया कार्यस्थल की मूल परीक्षण के उपरान्त structural consultant द्वारा pile foundation का प्रविधान प्रस्तावित किया गया।

चक गंजरिया फार्म के विकसित हो जाने के कारण उपलब्ध भूमि सड़क से लगभग 2.20 मीटर नीची हो गई है जिससे मकानों के ढिंध्य की ऊँचाई भी 2.20 मीटर करना आवश्यक हो गया। चक गंजरिया का LDA द्वारा सम्पादित कर्ताये गये विकारा कार्य के परवरा भूमि नीची हो जाने के कारण जलभराव की भी समस्या उत्पन्न हो रही है और ड्रेनेज की भी व्यवस्था करने हेतु परिसर में मिट्टी भराई किया जाना आवश्यक प्रतीत होता है। इस कारण वास्तुविद एवं आई०आई०आई०टी० लखनऊ के निदेशक मण्डल से वार्तानुसार न्यूनतम मिट्टी भराई लगभग 1.20 मीटर लेने का निर्णय लिया गया है जिससे जलभराव की स्थिति में उत्पन्न होने वाले तथः ड्रेनेज भी नेचुरल तरीके से हो सके। परिसर में मिट्टी भराव की स्थिति को देखते हुए बाउण्ड्रीवाल को भी रिटेनिंग वाल की तरह बनना पड़ा। पूर्व में बाउण्ड्रीवाल की ऊँचाई मात्र 1.60 मी० ही गई थी परन्तु बाउण्ड्रीवाल की ऊँचाई परिसर की स्थिति को देखते हुए सड़क के लेवल से 1.90 मीटर रखी गई है। जिसमें उत्तकी कुल ऊँचाई 4.00 मी० हो गई है। तथा मिट्टी भराई होने के कारण बाउण्ड्रीवाल में रिटेनिंग वाल तथा चढ़ावों की आवश्यकता हुई है जिससे उत्तकी जागत में काफी वृद्धि हो गई है।

अतः भूमि की भौगोलिक स्थिति को अनुसर आगमन को पुनरीक्षित करने की आवश्यकता हुई है। प्रथम चरण के कार्यों में पूर्व में लिए गये प्रतिधान (प्रारम्भिक स्वीकृति आगमन) एवं BOG द्वारा मानचित्रों में बदलाव एवं उपलब्ध भूमि की वर्तमान स्थिति को देखते हुए प्रथम फेज के कार्यों एवं परिसर क्रियाशील करने हेतु आगमन पुनरीक्षित किया जा रहा है।

भूमि :- प्रस्तावित भारतीय सूचना प्रौद्योगिकी संस्थान चक गंजरिया फार्म, लखनऊ में 50 एकड़ भूमि प्राविधिक शिक्षा विभाग, उत्तर प्रदेश के नाम उपलब्ध कराई गई थी। इसके अतिरिक्त चक गंजरिया फार्म के विकसित होने के उपरान्त परिसर सड़क से लगभग 2.20 मीटर नीचा हो गया। जिसमें मिट्टी भराई इत्यादि का भी प्राविधान करना आवश्यक हो गया है। उपलब्ध भूमि पर **बबूल** के जागत इत्यादि उर्गे हुए थे जिनको हटाने के लिए दल विभाग द्वारा आगमन प्रस्ताव किया गया जिसका समावेश भी इस आगमन में कर लिया गया है।


This is with reference to our meeting with the Principal Secretary, Technical Education, U.P. Govt., Lucknow alongwith other officials and visit of site under construction for IIT-PPP, Lucknow, U.P. at Chak Ganjeria, Lucknow.

It has been noted that there was no provision of ACs in the project plan of the building. You are aware that the Institution will impart education to the students of IT branch which requires large nos. of Computer Labs, Server and Networking Equipments etc. So it would be very difficult to run the classes and labs without provision of ACs. It has also been observed that the land of the construction site is low by approx. 2.20 mtrs which may be prone to water logging during rainy season.

It is suggested that to avoid the problem of water logging some land scaping work should be planned in such a way that minimum earth filling is required at the present site.

In view of the above, you are requested to kindly revise the estimate accordingly and submit to appropriate authorities for approval.

Item No. 1: To confirm the Minutes of the Fifth Meeting of the Governing Body held on June 13, 2016

The Governing Body confirmed the Minutes of the Fifth Meeting.

Item No. 2: To report the Action Taken on the Minutes of the Fifth Meeting of the Governing Body held on June 13, 2016

The Governing Body took note of the Action Taken Report.

Item No. 3:

- (a) **To review the progress of the ongoing constructions work as per approved building plan and map.**

The Governing Body took note of the progress of ongoing construction and emphasized the need to push the pace of construction so that it can be finished within stipulated time.

- (b) **To consider the request of M/s UPRNN Limited regarding approval of PMC Charges**

The matter was deliberated by the Governing Body. Secretary State, Technical Education State Govt informed the members that for similar works, 12.5% charges are being claimed by UPRNN. After a detailed discussion and looking into how PMC charges are processed at other IITs or IITs, it was resolved to accept the proposed 5% PMC Charges- 1.5% architectural charges.

- (c) **To consider the revised estimate submitted by M/s Uttar Pradesh Rajkiya Nirman Nigam Limited, Lucknow, Project Monitoring Consultant (PMC) of the construction works of IIT-PPP, Lucknow**

The Governing body resolved that the revised estimate should be relooked again meticulously by the Committee consisting of Mentor Director, representative of State Govt, GM UPRNN, Architect and other Civil Engineer expert either from IIT Kanpur or MNNIT Allahabad. The land filling proposal also needs to be rechecked by the same group.

Item No. 4: To apprise the hiring of temporary premises nearby Lucknow.

The Board did not approve the proposal to hire the premises in Lucknow. However, underscoring the space problem faced by IIT Allahabad and also understanding the importance to allow IITL to develop and grow on its own, the Governing body resolved that efforts should be made to start classes in some hired premises in Allahabad or any other nearby place till the regular building is available. Towards this, the Board also resolved to increase the intake of students and expand the courses, further the Board desired that the efforts should be made to open minimum two or more branches and to increase the intake of students to 250 over next 2-3 years.

Item No. 5: To approve initial requirement of various Teaching and Non-Teaching positions for IIT- PPP, Lucknow campus

The Governing Body resolved that sanctioned post in the ratio of 12:1:1:1 should be sanctioned on the total present strength of the students.

With reference to the letter no. IITL/MD/2017/4 dated 24.10.2017, regarding Construction of IIT Lucknow Campus at Lucknow, a visit to IIT Lucknow was made on 10.11.2017 along with Registrar IIT Allahabad and DR IIT Allahabad as per the nomination by the Director MNNIT Allahabad. Based on the site visit and the documents provided, some important observations and recommendations were made (Annexure I).

- Subsequently, a meeting of the architect, project manager UPRNN, Interim Registrar IIT Lucknow, associated faculty of IIT Allahabad and experts from MNNIT Allahabad was arranged by Interim Registrar, IIT-Lucknow on 29.11.2017 at MNNIT Allahabad. The recommendations already made were discussed in detail and the architect and project manager (UPRNN) were advised to review the requirement of earth (land) filling in light of suggestions made.
- Subsequently, the details were prepared and submitted by the architect through Interim Registrar, IIT Lucknow vide letter no. IIT-L/UPRNN/38/2017 dated 21.12.2017 (copy enclosed) to MNNIT Allahabad. Further, the 1st revised estimate for land filling was reduced to 83187.99 m³ (about 48.98% of the original quantity of land filling) vide letter no. 460/अ.प्र.उ. (IIT इकाई)/IIT कां. अभि/2018 dated 31.01.2018 (copy enclosed).
- It has been observed that the 1st revised estimate for land filling includes filling around the buildings for Fire Safety and plinth protection & the land filling near the boundary wall. The proposal for the land filling around the buildings for Fire Safety and plinth protection is technically desirable. However, it is recommended that the land filling near the boundary wall may not be required as the boundary wall structure is already constructed and no distress in the existing structure due to differential earth levels have not been reported.
- It is also recommended that drawings submitted may also indicate locations of rain water harvesting recharge pits so as to bring clarity about the catchment area supported by each rain water harvesting recharge pit.
- Further it is also suggested that the savings made from the reduction in earth (land) filling quantity may be utilized in meeting the requirement of original scope in the design of academic/administrative block.


The following observations and recommendations are made based on site visit and documents provided:


Observations:

- The Project Site is located on a Non Residential Area with adjoining roads on two sides on a newly developed area therefore is not expected to receive municipal waste inflow from outside.
- The plinth levels of the buildings have been fixed with reference to the main roads which is 2.20m above NGL.
- The reduced levels provided by the PMC, indicate that the site is fairly a flat terrain with lower reduced levels when compared with adjoining main road level. [Trough topography]
- It has been reported that the road network, surface drainage system and sewer line network have not been designed.
- The total additional cost of the land filling is estimated at Rs 10.00 crore.
- The Academic and Administrative Block is under construction. As reported, the structure is five storey and seven storey respectively and the foundation constructed is for proposed five storey and seven storey respectively.
- The requirements of utilities and space for different buildings are under revision as reported.

Recommendations:

- The design of road network, surface drainage system and sewer line network is desirable to obtain an engineering solution to the problem of water logging during the rainy season as reported.
- The item of land filling needs review in light of the following :
 - The low lying land formation can be appropriately landscaped. Road network as well as pavement section may be designed to prevent excessive water logging during the rainy seasons. Active [limited pumping, discharge through storm water drains] and passive forms like rain water harvesting may be adopted for surface water drainage.
 - Drains along the roads may be designed to ensure efficient surface run off.
 - Exposed sewer line may be covered with soil formation. The drainage requirement is primarily for surface drainage therefore appropriate rainwater harvesting mechanism(s) may be incorporated.
 - The collective response of these provisions will lead to sustainable and cost effective engineering solution to the problem of water logging and flooding in the proposed campus.
- The requirements of utilities and space for different buildings may be formalized as per the Users' recommendations meeting the essential requirements of campus functioning. Reduction in nos. of storeys of the building needs to be done carefully as it will lead to a loss in the structural value of the foundation which is designed for initially approved number of storeys.







May kindly like to refer to the resolution taken in the Sixth Meeting of the Governing Body of IIT Lucknow, that met on 5/10/2017. In respect of Agenda Item No 3(c) as stated below, the resolution taken is reproduced as below:

Agenda: To consider the revised estimate submitted by M/S Uttar Pradesh Rajkiya Nirman Nigam Limited, Lucknow, Project Monitoring Consultant (PMC) of the construction works of IIT-PPP, Lucknow.

Resolution: The Governing Body resolved that the revised estimate should be relooked again meticulously by the committee consisting of Mentor Director, Representative of State Government, GM UPRNN, Architect and other Civil Engineer Expert either from IIT Kanpur or MNNIT Allahabad. The land filling proposal also needs to be rechecked by the same group.

Consequent upon the circulation of the draft minutes, IIT Allahabad in its capacity of the Mentor Institution, undertook to write to the Director, MNNIT to nominate a suitable Civil Engineering Expert to look into the revised estimate of Earth Filling etc, as per the resolution of the Governing Body. The visit of the designated Expert Prof L K Mishra was undertaken in November 2017 to have a first hand look and feel of the prevailing site conditions. After further exchange of the required documents and follow up meetings between the MNNIT Civil Engineering team, IITA Officials, Architect and the UPRNN (PMC) officials, the final report of the MNNIT Experts was received by the Institute in February 2018. The same was expeditiously sent to UPRNN, to have a look at the suggestions made from MNNIT Experts and to agree or contradict thereupon, through IITA Communication dated 21/2/2018. The List of participants who attended the meeting in person is attached at Annexure-I. Directors of IITs attended the meeting through VC.

At the outset, Education Secretary, who chaired the meeting welcomed all the participants and stated that the meeting has been scheduled to monitor the progress of infra projects of IITs. The Chairman observed that the progress of infra project works in IITs is slow and we have to push it up. The Chairman shared his vision about completion of infra project works for IITs specially which are in Public Private Partnership mode (PPP). He also briefed about Higher Education Funding Agency (HEFA) which would finance the infrastructure requirements of the higher educational Institutions.

1. Certain key issues in regard to IITs established in PPP mode deliberated in the meeting are summarized below: -

- (i) The Chairman stated that the meeting has been scheduled to make standards to be followed for infra projects and asked the participants to share their views about it. After deliberation, keeping the Cabinet Note in view, it has been decided to follow the below standards before finalizing the Master plan: -
 - (a) Campus should be built for 1200 students.
 - (b) Infrastructure including playground should be built to the extent of maximum of 300 sq. feet per student.
 - (c) Capital cost of each Institute should not go beyond approved ceiling i.e 128.00 crore. Any escalation in the Capital cost will be borne either by the institute by their internal resources or by the Industry partner.
 - (d) Master plan should be prepared in a manner that campus has a good design along with the facilities of water harvesting, green building, energy saving etc.

- submit a timeline for finalizing the Master Plan, PMC and nomination of construction agency along with the deadline of commencement & completion of civil work to prevent the cost overrun of the project. (44)
- (ii) The Chairman suggested that all IITs, except IITs at Guwahati, Lucknow, Sri City (Chittoor) and Kottayam where the construction is in advance stage, send a detailed proposal for applying in HEFA with all relevant documents so that the Institutes will not face any difficulty due to paucity of funds. The proposal should be sent by end of Apr'18 to the ministry.
- (iv) The Ministry should give the priority to release of grants to the IITs at Guwahati, Lucknow, Sri City (Chittoor) and Kottayam where the construction is in advance stage so that they could finish the construction works in time.
- (v) Further, Mentor Directors of IITs at Sonapat, Kota, Bhopal and Ranchi expressed their issues with the concerned State Govt. In this regard, the Chairman advised to call the concerned State Govt. officials to short out the issues.
- (vi) It is stated by the ministry that if layout/ Master plan is approved by the BoG, it should not come back to the ministry again for approval.

2. IITDM Jabalpur and Kancheepuram

The Chairman directed Director (IITs), Under Secretary (IITs) and ADG (CPWD) to make a visit at the IITDM Jabalpur before the end of April, 2018 since there are lot many issues of the institute with CPWD. Directors of these Institutes have been advised to go for HEFA and repay them from their internal revenue generation. Also the EFC proposal to be prepared in consultation with IPD on priority. Arbitration cost also to be added in the EFC proposal of Kancheepuram.

- (i) The Chairman instructed the mentor Director to take necessary steps for shifting in permanent campus at Kurnool. To make it possible, it has been advised to expedite the process of release of grants to IITDM Kurnool in Capital Head for equipment, furniture etc. other than civil works.
- (ii) Mentor Director has been suggested to submit a proposal, based on the recommendation of EFC, for applying in HEPA.

- (i) Accordingly, the members present were apprised that Consequent upon the circulation of the draft minutes, IIT Allahabad, in its capacity of the Mentor Institution, had undertaken to write to the Director, MNNIT to nominate a suitable Civil Engineering Expert to look into the revised estimate of Earth Filling etc, as per the resolution of the Governing Body. The visit of the designated Expert Prof L K Mishra was undertaken in November 2017 to have a first hand look and feel of the prevailing site conditions. After further exchange of the required documents and follow up meetings between the MNNIT Civil Engineering team, IITA Officials, Architect and the UPRNN (PMC) officials, the final report of the MNNIT Experts was received by the Institute in February 2018 (Copy attached as Ann.1). The same was expeditiously sent to UPRNN, to have a look at the suggestions made from MNNIT Experts and to agree or contradict thereupon, by IITA. Based upon the MNNIT Civil Engineering Experts report so received, it was also desired that UPRNN may now like to come out with a FRESH revised proposal such that the IIT Lucknow project could be completed in a most befitting manner within the allocated 128 Crore Rupees. It was also desired that the premises should be so managed and completed within the present budgetary allocation that whatever portion can be made, a larger part of it should be functional from institutional point of view, so that Institute may look forward to being occupied as soon as possible.
- (ii) With a view to emphasise the same, a team of the Registrar (I), Head IT and the Deputy Registrar (Fin & Acc.) also held an onsite meeting with the Project Manager, UPRNN and the Project Architects on 7/3/18. After the meeting the Project Manager, UPRNN and the Architects have desired to have time till about 15/3/18 to come out with a FRESH Plan and Estimation, with the objective of coming out with a functional and occupiable building by IIT Lucknow, within the allocated budget of Rs 128.00 Crores. The budgetary allocation also includes the estimate of about Rs 13.00 Crores for

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procurement of Computers, Servers, Furniture / & Furnishings, Equipping of Laboratories and Hostels, etc.

- (ii) Against the above backdrop, UPRNN had worked out a FRESH estimate for Rs. 129 Crores, as at **Ann. 2.**
- (iv) The presented estimate includes the almost completed super structure of the composite Academic-cum-Administration Block (19,818.40 Sq.mts.) and Residential hostel for Boys and Girls (4177.51 Sq mts.). A total of thus 23,996 Sq mts say 24,000 Sq mts. The Super structure has a further provision of another two Floors in one wing of the building that would add up to 6320 Sq mts. if so required in future. Playfield area envisaged is 18,400 Sq mts.
- (v) In keeping with the broad norms that were set in the Video Conferencing meeting Chaired by the Secretary, MHRD on 23/3/18, that the present campuses of IITs PPP should be envisaged for accomodating about 1200 students with 300 Sq Ft. space for each student, the present scope of works for IIT Lucknow has been restricted to that of 2,58,240 Sq Ft. (Equivalent to 24,000 Sq Mts.) with a provision for further expansion.
- (vi) The present scope of works, since includes, few general Campus facilities of essential nature like Boundary Wall of the entire Campus, Substation, DG Sets, Tube well, Inter Connecting Roads, horticultural provisions, etc, the construction of complete Faculty & Staff Housing (Only for skeletal and emergency staff provision is included in present scope), additional Girls/ Boys Hostels, Auditorium, etc has to be put on hold at present. Also in order to have a secure functional campus for the initial batches, within the current allocation of Rs 128 Crs., arrangement for finishing the building to upto G+2 Floors has been envisaged. For the rest the super-structure is built, which may be finished and furnished subsequently.
- (vii) The members went through the various provisions made and also undertook a visit to the building to have a glimpse of the ongoing as well as the completed works. The members also discussed the project progress with the UPRNN Engineers and officials on site about the completion time frame. Upon being apprised that subject to the smooth fund flow, the building could be handed over in latest by January 2019. Upon this the members tried to emphasise upon the officials to hasten the progress and see that the building was available before that, as funds were not a constraint at present.
- (viii) While going through the estimates, the members were explained by the UPRNN explicitly about the quantities been taken by them now after receiving the Civil Engineering Experts reports. It was apprised that the quantities had been revised to limit to an expenditure of Rs. 4.28 Crs. from the earlier one of Rs. 10.43 Crs. The revised estimates included only the earthwork around the perimeter walls of the Academic - cum-Administrative Block, Hostel building and the connecting Roads (Pertinent to mention that the allocated site is about 2.2 mts. below the adjoining Road levels and therefore the need for earth filling item). The Architect was advised to include item by item justification for the entire earth filling work . UPRNN was further advised to ensure that all statutory compliances pertaining to earthwork and fire fighting must be ensured by them, to which they assured.

The meeting then concluded with an agreement on the fresh proposal submitted by UPRNN, as attached already at **Ann. 2.**

With reference to the letter no. CEP/MNNIT/17/14 dated 24.10.2017, regarding Construction of IIT Lucknow Campus at Lucknow, a visit to IIT Lucknow was made on 10.11.2017 along with Registrar IIT Allahabad and DR IIT Allahabad as per the nomination by the Director MNNIT Allahabad. Based on the site visit and the documents provided, some important observations and recommendations were made (Annexure I).

- Subsequently, a meeting of the architect, project manager UPRNN, Interim Registrar IIT Lucknow, associated faculty of IIT Allahabad and experts from MNNIT Allahabad was arranged by Interim Registrar, IIT Lucknow on 29.11.2017 at MNNIT Allahabad. The recommendations already made were discussed in detail and the architect and project manager UPRNN were advised to review the requirement of earth (land) filling in light of suggestions made.
- Subsequently, the details were prepared and submitted by the architect through Interim Registrar, IIT Lucknow vide letter no. IIT LU/UPRNN/38/2017 dated 21.12.2017 (copy enclosed) to MNNIT Allahabad. Further, the 1st revised estimate for land filling was reduced to 53181.99 m³ (about 48.98% of the original quantity of land filling) vide letter no. 0606/04.2. (IT 2015)/IIT 002/03/2018 dated 31.01.2018 (copy enclosed).
- It has been observed that the 1st revised estimate for land filling includes filling around the buildings for Fire Safety and plinth protection & the land filling near the boundary wall. The proposal for the land filling around the buildings for Fire Safety and plinth protection is technically desirable. However, it is recommended that the land filling near the boundary wall may not be required as the boundary wall structure is already constructed and no distress in the existing structure due to differential earth levels have not been reported.
- It is also recommended that drawings submitted may also indicate locations of rain water harvesting recharge pits so as to bring clarity about the catchment area supported by each rain water harvesting recharge pit.
- Further it is also suggested that the savings made from the reduction in earth (land) filling quantity may be utilized in meeting the requirement of original scope in the design of academic/administrative block.


The following observations and recommendations are made based on site visit and documents provided:


Observations:

- The Project Site is located on a Non Residential Area with adjoining roads on two sides on a newly developed area therefore is not expected to receive municipal waste inflow from outside.
- The plinth levels of the buildings have been fixed with reference to the main roads which is 2.20m above NGL.
- The reduced levels provided by the PMC, indicate that the site is fairly a flat terrain with lower reduced levels when compared with adjoining main road level. [Trough topography]
- It has been reported that the road network, surface drainage system and sewer line network have not been designed.
- The total additional cost of the land filling is estimated at Rs 10.00 crore.
- The Academic and Administrative Block is under construction. As reported, the structure is five storey and seven storey respectively and the foundation constructed is for proposed five storey and seven storey respectively.
- The requirements of utilities and space for different buildings are under revision as reported.

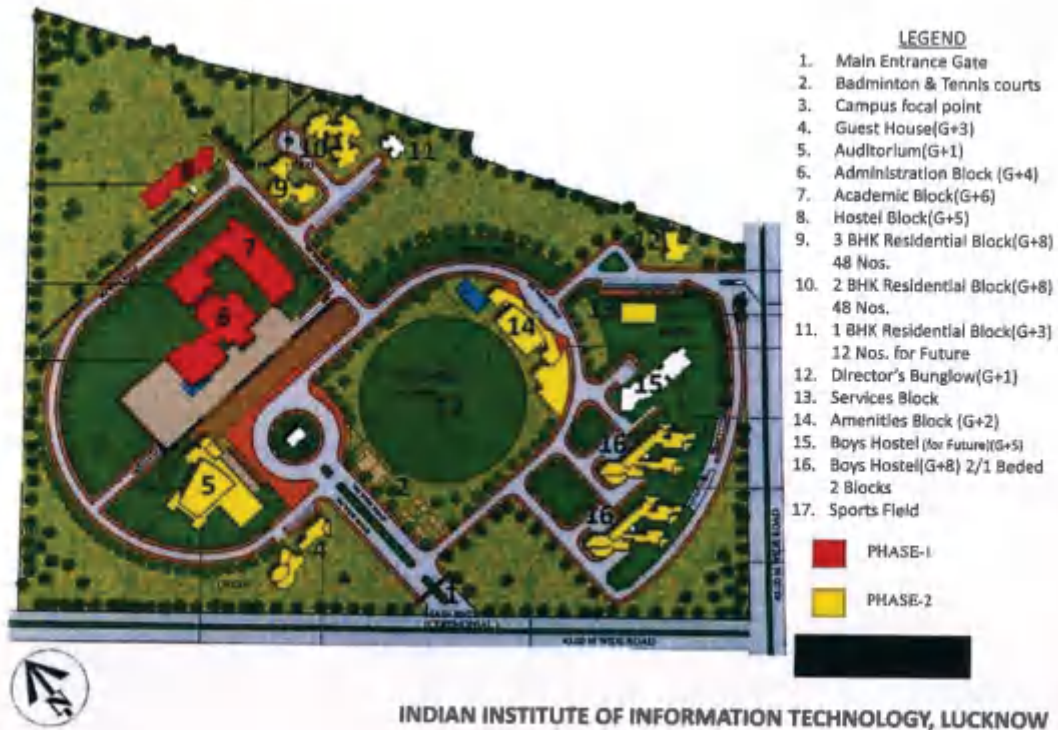
Recommendations:

- The design of road network, surface drainage system and sewer line network is desirable to obtain an engineering solution to the problem of water logging during the rainy season as reported.
- The item of land filling needs review in light of the following :
 - o The low lying land formation can be appropriately landscaped. Road network as well as pavement section may be designed to prevent excessive water logging during the rainy seasons. Active [limited pumping, discharge through storm water drains] and passive forms like rain water harvesting may be adopted for surface water drainage.
 - o Drains along the roads may be designed to ensure efficient surface run off.
 - o Exposed sewer line may be covered with soil formation. The drainage requirement is primarily for surface drainage therefore appropriate rainwater harvesting mechanism(s) may be incorporated.
 - o The collective response of these provisions will lead to sustainable and cost effective engineering solution to the problem of water logging and flooding in the proposed campus.
- The requirements of utilities and space for different buildings may be formalized as per the users' recommendations meeting the essential requirements of campus functioning. Reduction in nos. of storeys of the building needs to be done carefully as it will lead to a loss in the structural value of the foundation which is designed for initially approved number of storeys.

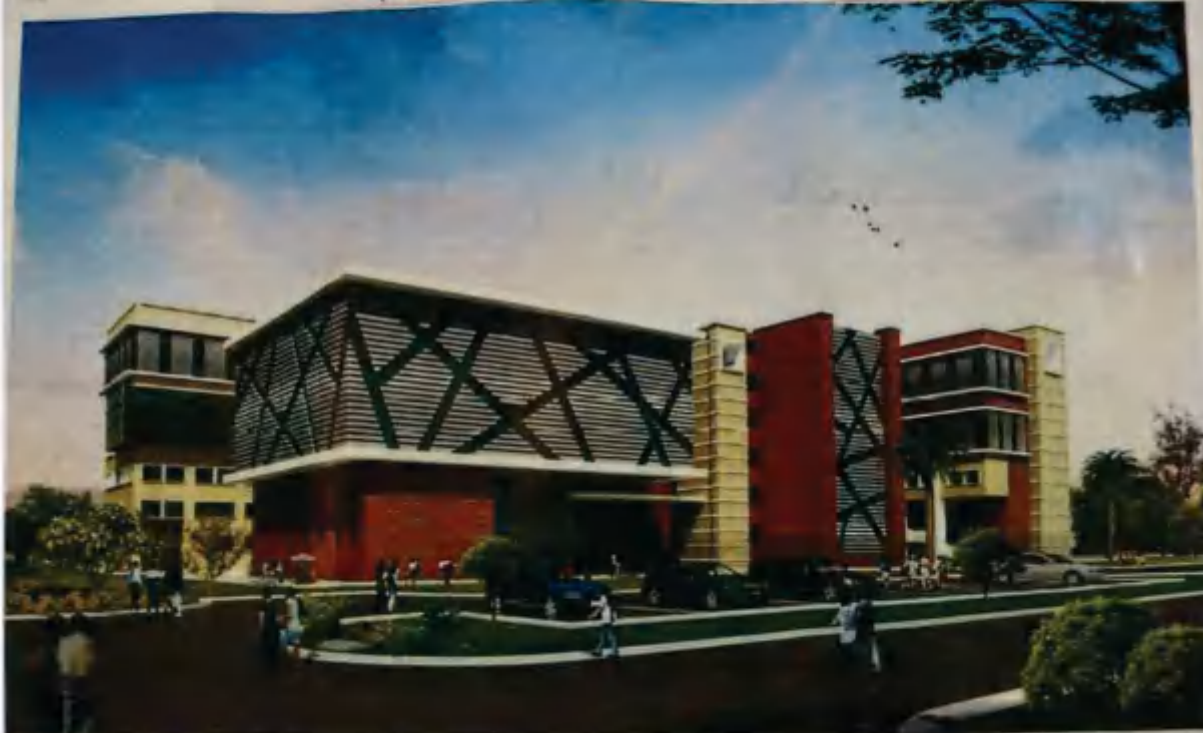

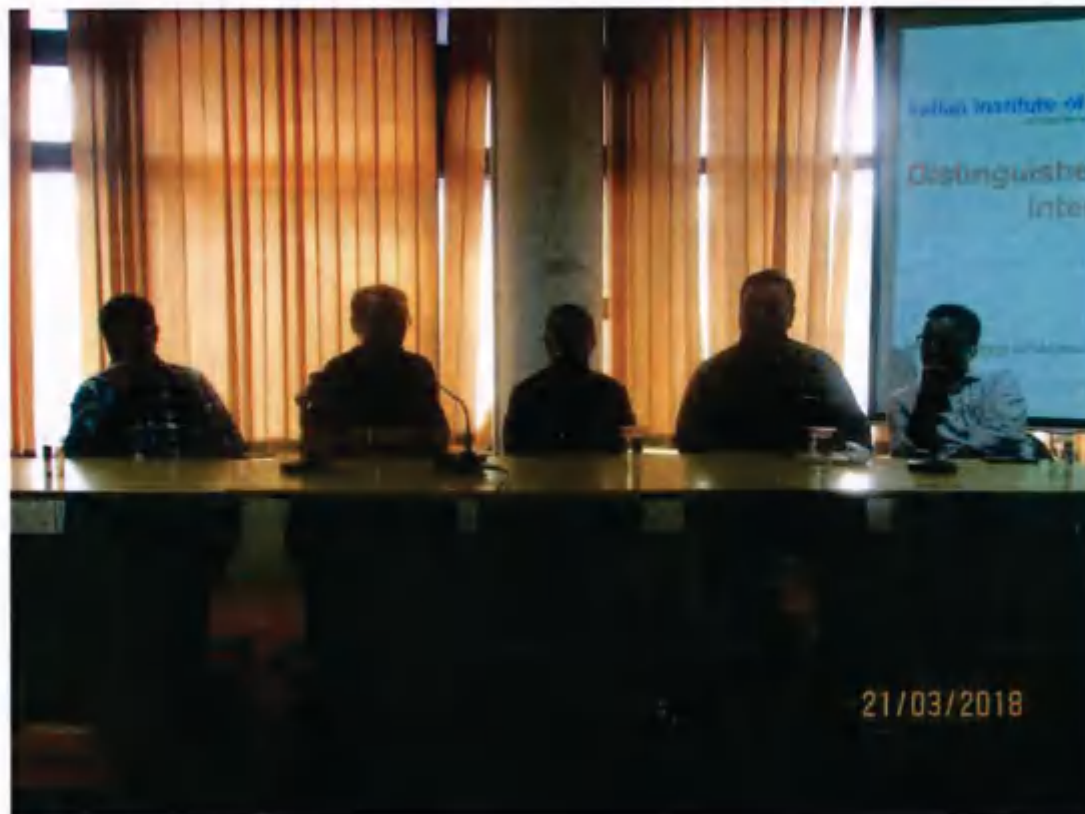

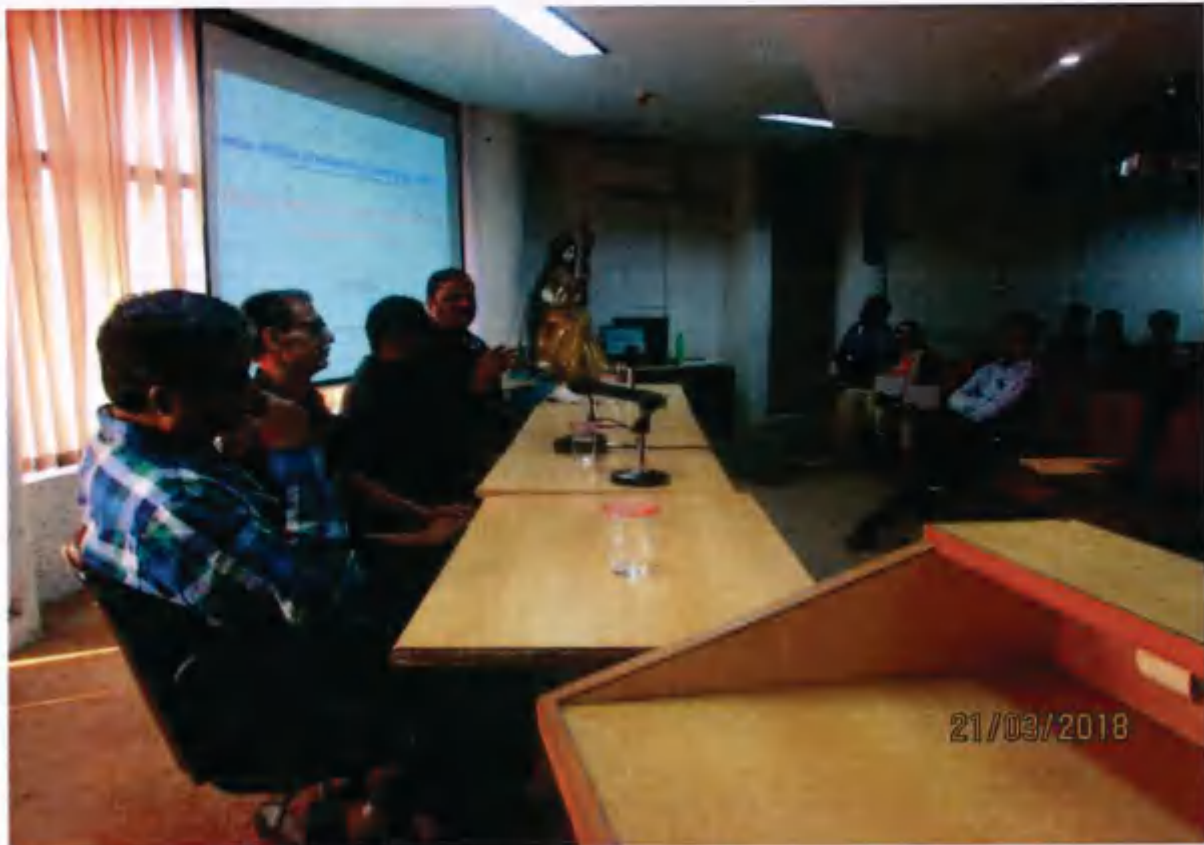
