The campus of IIIT Lucknow is in 50 acres of land at Chak Ganjaria Region, Gomti Nagar Extension, Lucknow in Uttar Pradesh. The Institute is being set up with financial contributions from MoE, Govt. of India; Govt. of Uttar Pradesh, and U. P. Electronics Corporation Ltd. as industry partners in the ratio of 50:35:15 respectively towards the capital expenditure.

The mission of IIIT Lucknow is to be a unique and world class nucleating "Apex Center of Excellence" in the area of Information Technology to enhance India's Technological strength in Information Technology. IIIT seeks to derive its strength from a linkage with sound Indian traditions of centuries past, and sets out to create knowledge-based resources in regional languages.

Initially, the administrative and academic activities of the Institute were started at the IIIT Allahabad, which was the mentoring Institute of IIIT Lucknow. The Institute shifted to its permanent campus at Lucknow in Aug 2019.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, all the academic and co-curricular activities such as conducting online classes, online exams, online cultural and technical activities, opening and closing of academic sessions and placements were completed on time without any break.

About

Department of Information Technology is the oldest running department in IIIT Lucknow from 2015 onwards. It consists of a team of highly dedicated, learned and well-qualified faculties with a wide expertise in all the areas of Information Technology. Information Technology deals with the application of computers to solve real-world problems to facilitate businesses and create Information Systems. As the world becomes technologically advanced every day, well-trained IT professionals are needed.

Courses designed by IIITL are according to the industry needs. Department of IT provides B.Tech. (IT) and PhD programmes. The students are admitted for B.Tech. program through JOSAA and CSAB based on merit. For PhD programme, the selections are held every year in June-July and December-January. Currently there are six PhD candidates and four batches of B.Tech. with a total of around 200 students. The curriculum is revised regularly to keep up the future needs of the industries. The students are given all-round development by providing a blend of academics and research with professional ethics, physical health and extracurricular activities. Sufficient Job opportunities are provided by the placement cell of IIIT Lucknow. The IT graduates find jobs as- Data Analysts, IT Managers, Cyber Security expert, Cloud administrator, Network administrator and telecommunications to name a few.

The first Convocation of the Institute was held on 23rd April 2021 at Atal Bihari Vajpayee Scientific Convention Centre, Lucknow wherein, the successful candidates of batches 2015-2019, 2016-2020 and 2017-2021 were awarded degrees and Medals for their exemplary performance in their respective courses.








E-Cell - The Entrepreneurial Society








Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of the Indian Institute of Information Technology (PPP mode), Lucknow for the year ended 31 March, 2023

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Indian Institute of Information Technology (PPP mode), Lucknow (Institute) as at 31 March 2023, the Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 28(3) of the Indian Institutes of Information Technology (Public-Private Partnership) Act, 2017. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observation on financial transaction with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principle used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
- (i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account (ii) dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format of Financial Statements for Central Higher Educational Institutions (format) prescribed by Ministry of Education(Erstwhile Ministry

of Human Resource Development), Government of India.

- (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Indian Institute of Information Technology, Lucknow as required under Section 28(1) of the Indian Institutes of Information Technology (Public-Private Partnership) Act, 2017 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- (iv) We further report that:

(A) Notes to Accounts (Schedule-24)

The Institute has shown Rs. 209.81 lakh towards 'Provision for expenses – IIIT Allahabad' under Current Liabilities (Schedule-3), which has been depicted since 2017-18. This is neither in accordance with the Accounting principle nor as per format prescribed by MHRD. Therefore, the Institute must disclose this event under notes on accounts.

(B) Grants-in-aid

The Institute received Grants-in-aid of Rs. 125.00 lakh during the year. After taking opening balance of Rs. 2147.05 lakh and Interest amount of Rs. 87.07 lakh earned on grant account, the total fund available was worked out to Rs. 2359.12 lakh. The Institute utilised Rs. 238.09 lakh leaving a balance of Rs. 2121.03 lakh.

- (v) Subject to our observations on the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with books of accounts.
- (vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:
- (a) In so for as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Indian Institute of Information Technology, Lucknow as at 31 March 2023; and

(b) In so far as it relates to the Income & Expenditure Account of the 'surplus' for the year ended on that date.
