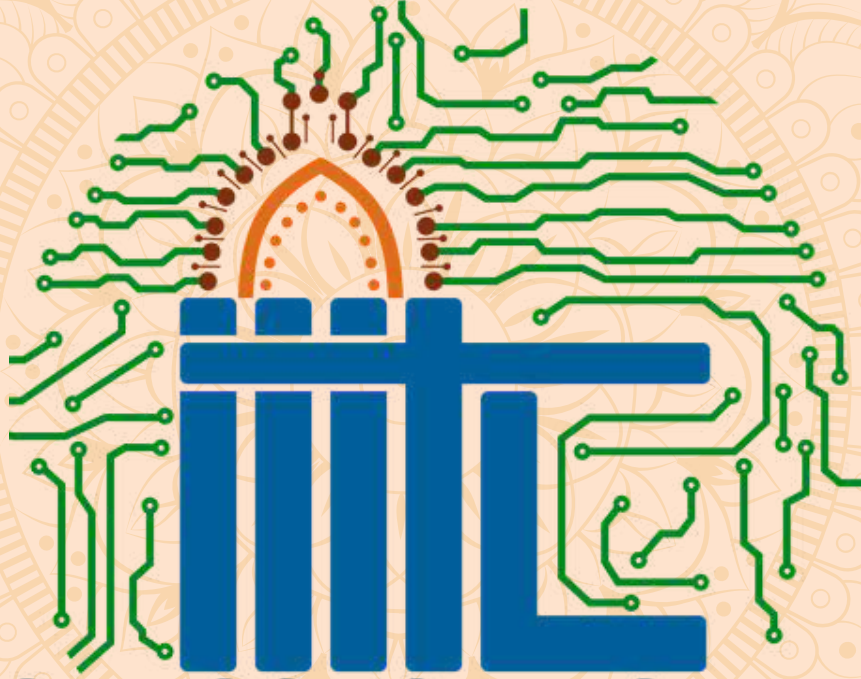

# About The Institute

Indian Institute of Information Technology Lucknow (IIIT Lucknow) is one of the 20 IIITs set up by the Central Government in the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) mode in 2015. In 2017, the institute was granted the status of Institute of National Importance under the purview of the IIIT (PPP) Act. In 2019, the institute moved to its allotted campus in Chak Ganjaria, C.G. City, Lucknow. Prior to this, the institute was functioning at IIIT Allahabad under their mentorship since its inception. The foundation stone of IIIT Lucknow campus was laid down in the year 2014. Uttar Pradesh Electronics Corporation Lucknow is the industry partner of the institute. Shri Vishad P. Mafatal, Padmanabh Mafatlal Group is the Chairperson, Board of Governors of the institute.

IIIT Lucknow admitted its first batch of B. Tech. in Information Technology with an intake of 50 students w.e.f. the academic session 2015-16. With the current enrollment of more than 1100 students, the institute offers an array of undergraduate and postgraduate programs such as B.Tech., M.Tech., M.Sc., MBA and PhD. The admission is made through centralized counselling of candidates who qualify in JEE (Mains), CCMT, CUET and CCMN.

Keeping abreast with the latest trends and needs of the market, IIIT Lucknow allows students to hone their skills in technology through specialized courses in Computer Science, Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning, Data Science, Information Technology, Digital Marketing etc. It also offers courses multi-disciplinary courses in areas such as Computer Science and Business, Economics and Management following the NEP 2020 recommendations.

The institute also encourages entrepreneurial activities among students. The Incubation Centre , Confederation for Research Entrepreneurship and Technology Enablement (C.R.E.A.T.E) of IIIT Lucknow came into existence in 2021. It works in collaboration with IIT Kanpur to build and further the sense of innovation in students.

The placement records of the institute are very encouraging. There has been an appreciable rise in the lowest, average, and highest CTC offered to the candidates with every passing year. The academic and non-academic facilities provided at the institute has boosted its credibility, and hence it has seen a jump in the closing rank of entrance seats.

The institute is dedicated towards providing an environment that supports learning, encourages research activities, and fosters a culture of innovation.

## Students

The Institute admitted 232 students through JEE (Mains)/CSAB 2023 to B.Tech. programmes, 34 students to M.Tech. (CS) programmes, 33 students admitted to MBA (Digital Business), 25 in M.Sc. in Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning, 24 in M.Sc. in Data Science, and 15 students are admitted in M.Sc. in Economics and Management. In addition seven students are admitted to Ph.D. programmes, out of which four are admitted to Working Professional category and three have taken admission under Self Finance Full Time admission category.

## Examination and Evaluation

The examination process is continuous, learning-oriented and transparent. Student's performance is evaluated on the basis of one midterm and one end term examination for each course, along with student's assessment based on regularity of attendance, submission of assignments, quizzes and class participation. The Institute is following relative grading system with seven letter grades to denote various levels of performance. The academic performance of each student is reviewed by a concerned course faculty. The academic performance is evaluated on the basis of grades, SGPI and CGPI, obtained in courses registered.

## **DEBATE:**



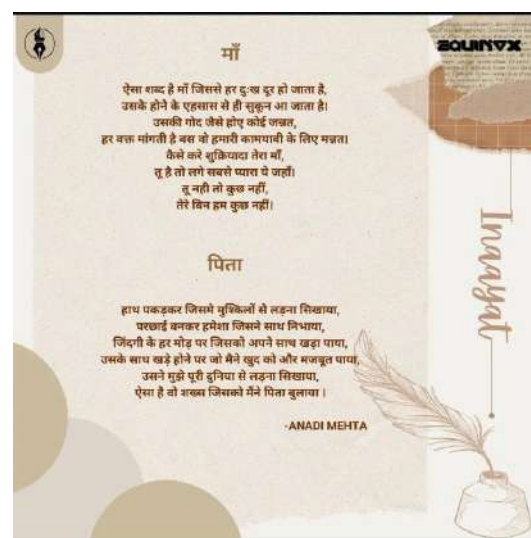

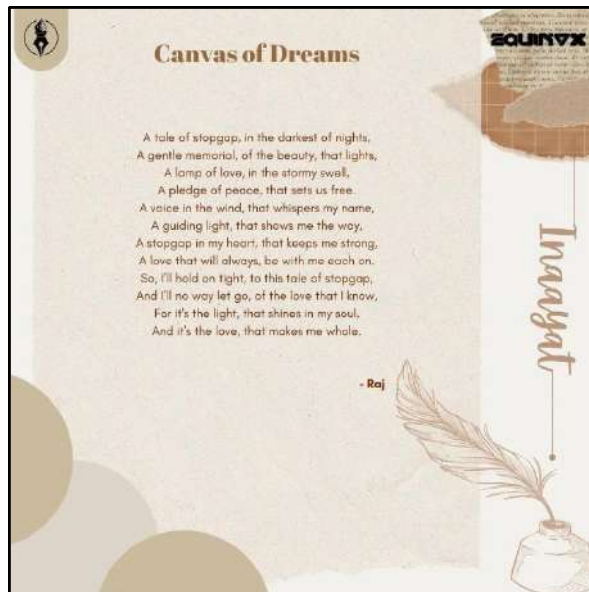
## QUIZZING:

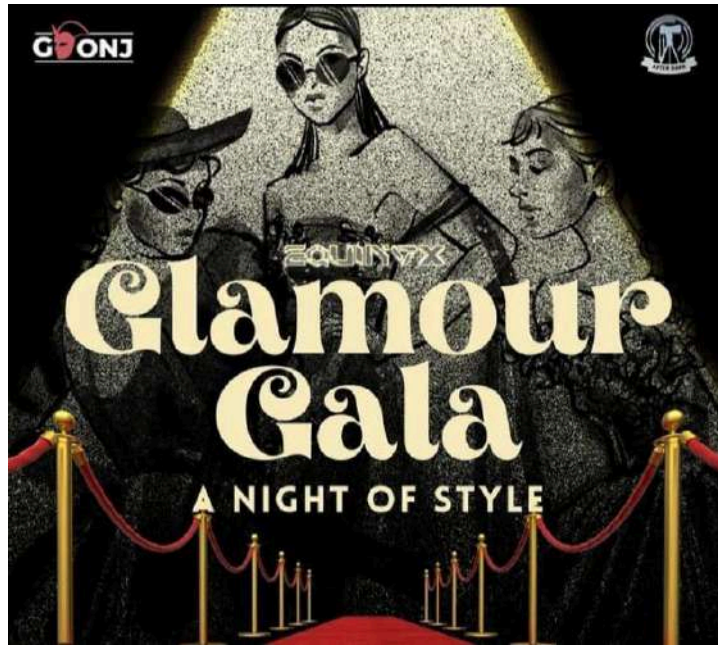
## **JOKES APART:**

● **Round 1: A Rapid Finance Quiz challenge** with 30 questions in 10 minutes, covering investment, trading, and finance.

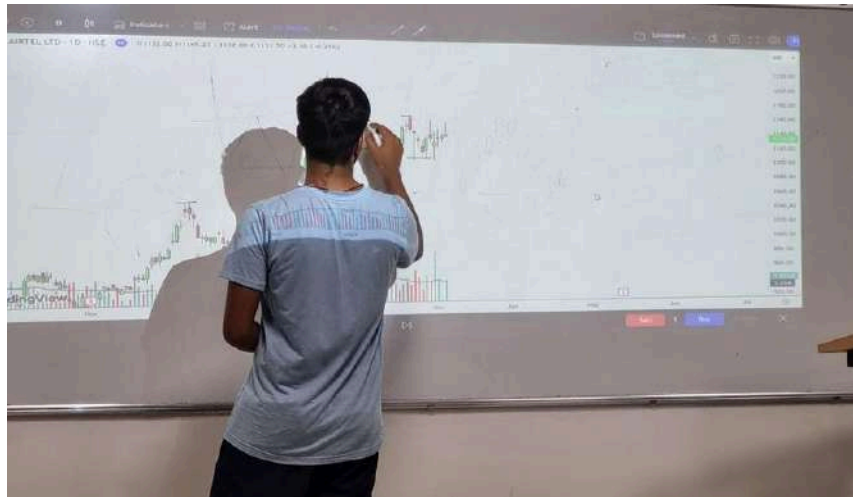

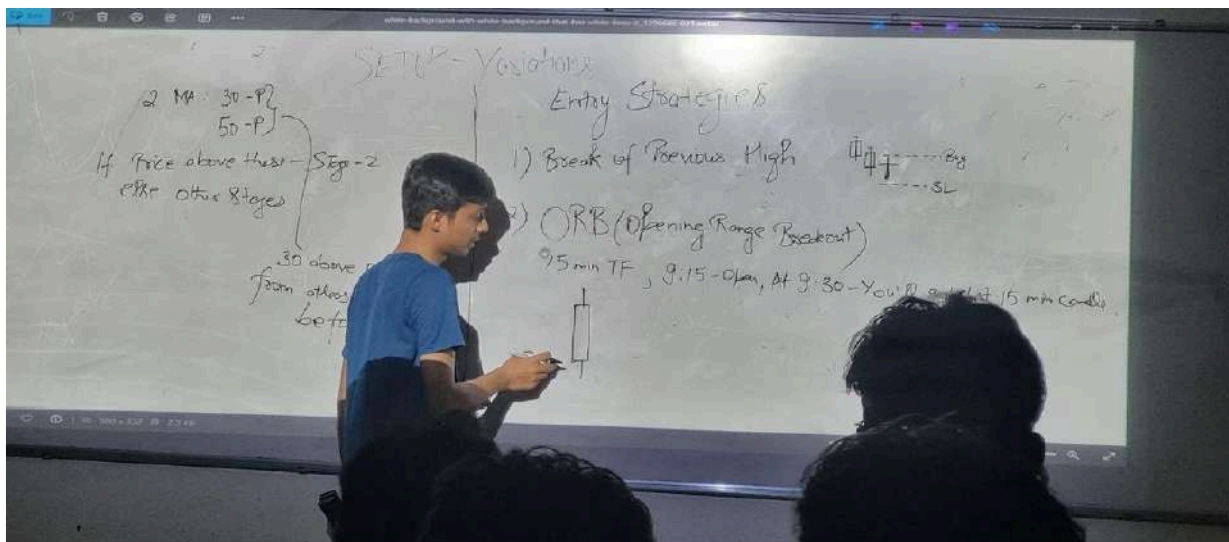
## REGULAR CLASSES:

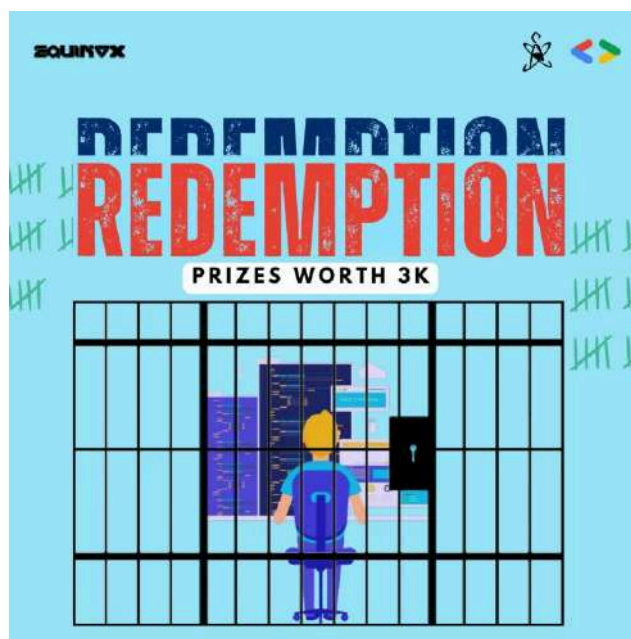

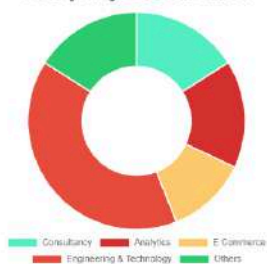

## Placement Statistics (B.Tech.) 2023-24

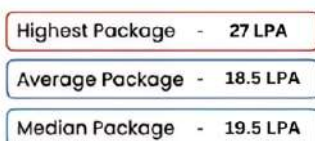

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Indian Institute of Information Technology (PPP mode), Lucknow (Institute) as at 31 March 2024, the Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 28 (3) of the Indian Institutes of Information Technology (Public-Private Partnership) Act, 2017. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observation on financial transaction with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

(i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;

(ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format of Financial Statements for Central Higher Educational Institutions (format) prescribed by MHRD.

(iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Institute.

(iv) We further report that:

**(A) General**

A security deposit of Rs. 88.88 lakh has been made with electricity department whereas the same is not reflected in the electricity bills. The Institute needs to take initiative with electricity department to get it updated and account the same under Loans and Advances.

**(B) Grants-in-aid**

During the year 2023-24, the Institute received Grants-in-aid of Rs. 6.54 crore from Government of Uttar Pradesh and earned interest receipts of Rs. 1.38 crore. After taking opening balance of Rs. 21.21 crore, the total fund available worked out to Rs. 29.13 crore. The institute utilized Rs. 0.83 crore during the year and refunded Rs. 0.92 crore, leaving a closing balance of Rs. 27.38 crore as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2024.

(v) Subject to our observations on the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with books of accounts.

(vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India;

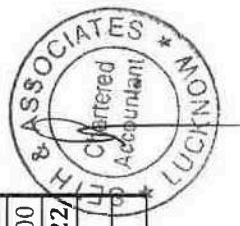

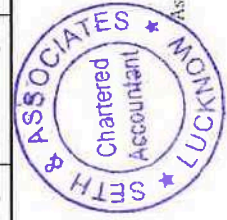



**SCHEDULE 23 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**1 BASIS FOR PREPARATION OF ACCOUNTS:**

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost conventions, unless and otherwise stated and on accrual basis of accounting, except as reported in Para 2.

**2 REVENUE RECOGNITION**

2.1 Fees from Students and Interest on Savings Bank Account are accounted on accrual basis.

2.2 Income from Land, Buildings and Other Property and Interest on Investments, if any are accounted on accrual basis.

**3 FIXED ASSETS:**

Fixed assets are stated at cost of acquisition including inward freight, duties and taxes, incidental and direct expenses related to the acquisition, installation & commissioning.

Fixed assets created out of Earmarked funds and Fund of Sponsored Projects, where the ownership of such assets vests in the institution, are set up by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed assets of the institution. Where of assets is vests with institution after use in projects, then value of assets is calculated after charging depreciation at the rate applicable to the respective assets.

Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation.

**4 INTANGIBLE ASSETS:**

Computer software, E-books and E-Journals are grouped under Intangible Assets. Computer Software, E-books and E-Journals purchased on subscription basis are amortized over the subscription period.

**5 DEPRECIATION:**

Depreciation on fixed assets has been charged on Straight Line method at rates as prescribed in the Uniform Accounting Standard for all education institutions by MHRD. Depreciation is provided for the whole year on additions during the year.

Where value after depreciation of Tangible assets is less than 5% of original cost, such assets is carried in Balance Sheet at 5% as residual value and will not be further depreciated.

Assets, the individual value of each of which is Rs 2000 or less ( except Library Books ) are treated as Small Value Assets, 100% depreciation is provided in respect of such assets at the time of their acquisition. However physical accounting & control are continued by the holders of such assets.

Expenditure on purchase of laboratory material, medicines, stationery items and other stores is accounted as revenue expenditure, except that the value of closing stocks held on 31st March 2024 is set up as inventories by reducing the corresponding Revenue Expenditure on the basis of information obtained. They are valued at cost.

**7 RETIREMENT BENEFITS:**

Provision towards Gratuity and Leave Encashment has been made as per Actuarial Valuation. Institute had not made any provision for pension as all employees are covered under NPS. Provision for leave encashment and Gratuity had been only provided for Regular employees

**8 GOVERNMENT GRANTS:**

8.1 Government Grants are accounted on realization basis. However, where a sanction for release of grant pertaining to current financial year is received before 31st March and the grant is actually received in the next financial year, the grant is accounted on accrual basis and an equal amount is shown as recoverable from the Grantor.

8.2 To the extent utilized towards capital expenditure, (on accrual basis) government grants are transferred to the Capital Fund.

8.3 Government grants for meeting Revenue Expenditure (on accrual basis) are treated, to the extent utilized, as income of the year in which they are realized.

8.4 Unutilized grants (including advances paid out of such grants) are carried forward and exhibited as a liability in the Balance Sheet.

**9 SPONSORED PROJECTS**

In respect of sponsored projects, the amount received from sponsors are credited to the head " Receipts against sponsored projects" under Current liabilities and provisions. As and when expenditure is incurred/advances are paid against such projects or the concerned project, account is debited with allocated overhead charges, the liability account is debited

**10 TAXATION:**

The income of the Institute is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10 (23C) of the Income Tax Act, 1961. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts.

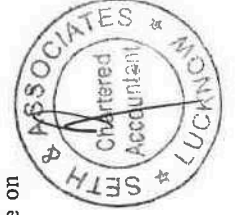

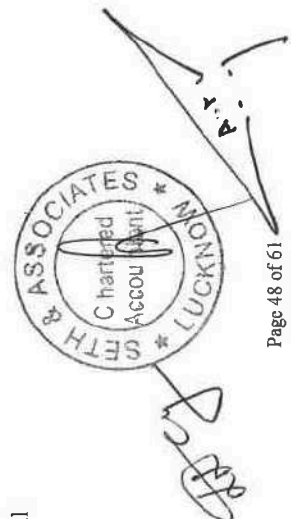

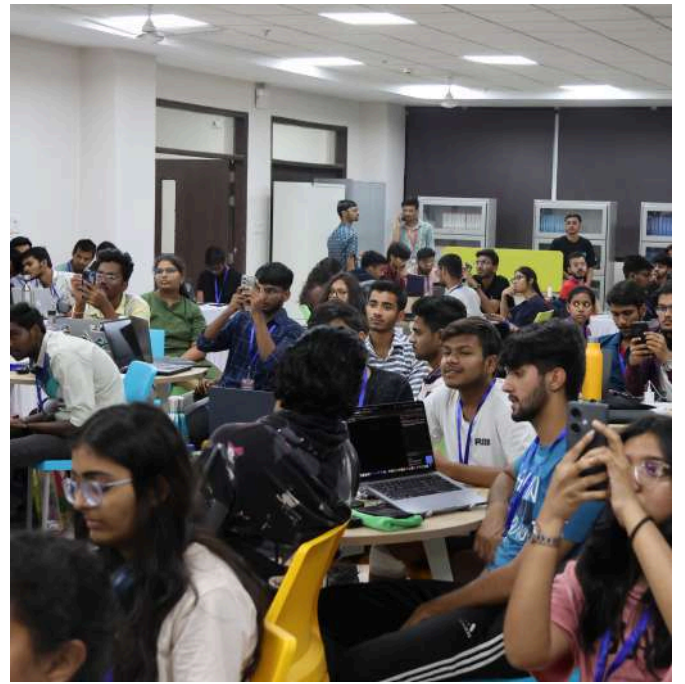
